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#### MINUTES

- 1. **Call to order-** The meeting was called to order by Mayor Bill Hurtley at 6:05 p.m.
- Roll Call- Members present: Mayor Bill Hurtley, Alderpersons Jim Brooks, Rick Cole, Dianne Duggan, Bill Lathrop, Gene Lewis, Joy Morrison and Erica Stuart. Others present: City Clerk Darnisha Haley, Community Development Director Jason Sergeant, Municipal Services Director Chad Renly, City Attorney Mark Kopp, Nathan Ward from USCellular and Nick Bubolz from Town & Country Engineering.
- 3. **Approval of Agenda** Brooks made a motion seconded by Cole to move agenda item 12A to become item 8B and change the verbiage in 12A to reference that change. Motion passed 7-0
- 4. **Approval of Minutes** Brooks made a motion, seconded by Cole to waive the reading of the minutes of February 9, 2021 meeting. Lathrop requested two changes, one on the spelling of Erica Stuarts name in Roll Call from Erick to Erica. The second change was to section 7A the fifth bullet point should not be a part of the library update it should be broken out separately. Motion passed 7-0

- 7. Reports of Committees
  - A. Library Board Report- Haley read the report prepared by Library Director Megan Kloeckner as follows:

#### General Updates

• A copy of the library's annual report is included in the Council packet along with a copy of one of our social media posts highlighting services from 2020.

#### Service Updates

- The library is now offering curbside and browsing services.
  - Patrons can schedule a curbside pickup by calling the library or online on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays.
  - Patrons can come in and browse the collections on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays.
  - Computers are available Monday-Saturday as well as copy and fax services.
- Programs are still limited to virtual activities and take-home kits.

- The library board has decided to suspend overdue fines through December 31, 2021 due to the economic impacts of the COVID-19 outbreak. This waiver is on all current fines due by patrons on overdue materials and on any future overdue items through the end of this calendar year. The waiver does not apply if materials are damaged or lost. It also does not apply if materials are checked out from another library that does charge fines on the materials.
- B. Youth Center Advisory Board Report- Did not meet
- C. **Plan Commission Report** Jason reported that the city going to be receiving an application officially for development in the Allen Creek corridor by N Union St.
  - Cole made a motion, seconded by Morrison to approve Resolution 2021-03 A Resolution Authorizing Acquisition of Real Estate-(Outlots-Westfield Meadows). Motion passed 7-0

#### D. Finance and Labor Relations Committee Report

- Cole made a motion, seconded by Duggan to accept the February 2021 City bills as presented in the amount of \$4,440,790.46. Motion passed 7-0 on a roll call vote.
- Cole made a motion, seconded by Morrison to approve Resolution 2021-02 Amending Fees Schedule for Operator's license fees. Motion passed 6-0 on a roll call vote. Brooks abstained from voting due to conflict of interest.
- Cole made a motion, seconded by Duggan to approve Resolution 2021-04 amending the 2020 Budget. Motion passed 7-0 on a roll call vote.
- Cole made a motion, seconded by Brooks to approve Department of Public Works Mechanic Job Description. Motion passed 7-0.
- E. **Public Safety Committee Report** Duggan reported the committee approved 5 operator license at their last meeting. EMS and the Police Dept are looking into doing a needs survey to determine what they need in order for the facilities to be more efficient. The Police Chief is looking into the possibility of hiring a company to do this needs survey and suggest that the city may want to take this on as a whole for all city facilities and not just EMS and police. Brooks cautioned taking on a needs study for EMS without exhausting possibilities with the Fire District.
  - Discussion on Waiver's, field rentals and city league baseball as it pertains to COVID-19.- Duggan brought up discussion on how to handle waivers, field rentals and the city baseball league and who should be held accountable for enforcement. Brooks stated that the 4th of July celebration will continue this year with celebration on Friday, Saturday and Sunday. They are doing everything they can to promote social distancing and promoting people to wear masks. Lathrop suggested adding certain guidelines to the waivers that the community must abide by and that they are renting/using the facilities as is.
- F. **Municipal Services Report**-Brooks reported that the State Apprenticeship program requested an audit of the people that deal with the apprentices on the Water & Light, they must complete a video training on anti-harassment. Public Service commission will meet on Thursday to discuss the moratorium on unpaid bills, it is expected that the moratorium will be lifted. Staff is working on a plan to help people be successful with payment plans. As of last week there are a total of 292

delinquent accounts out of about 3400 which is about 8%. The dollar amount of those arrearages total about \$186,000.

- Brooks made a motion, seconded by Cole to approve the MLA (Master Lease Agreement) with US Cellular for the installation of 5G small cell nodes. Motion approved 7-0 on a roll call vote.
- Brooks made a motion, seconded by Cole to approve the Centrex contract renewal with The Wisconsin Bell, Inc. d/b/a AT&T Wisconsin for City phone service for accounts 6088822281336 & 6088820560842. Motion approved 7-0 on a roll call vote.
- G. Economic Development Committee-Brooks reported Staff is working on getting an online permitting system up and running so that building permits can be requested online. Looking at comparisons over the years there were 230 permits issued in 2017, 366 in 2018, 338 in 2019 and 310 in 2020. Sergeant reported the zoning revisions to R1 allowing a front porch in the front setback has prompted two different inquiries to install a front porch in a setback. Hurtley reported that the city is now the owner of Nelson Paint Company.
- H. Parks and Recreation Board Report-Morrison reported that Boy Scouts held a successful fishery and derby. Renly reported he will be scheduling a sounding test for the dam repair to determine if the rebar will have to be replaced or not. Morrison also reported they received a quote from Sager fencing for the dog park. This will get installed sometime in the spring after the ground thaws out. The pool is looking in a software that will allow people to sign up for lessons and registration online. The request for proposal and quote for the new park, aquatic center and splash pad was approved. Sergeant reported that he's received about 5 inquiries so far on this project and there are a lot of interested parties. The deadline for submitting documents on this project is March 22<sup>nd</sup>. Morrison recognized Darryl Hamilton for his 6 years of service on the Park & Recreation Board. Mike Pfeil was pointed to full-fill the term of Darrel Hamilton which ends in 2021.
  - **Historic Preservation Commission-**Lewis reported 8 W Main submitted an application for a new wall sign, 32 W Main submitted an application for a screen door and 111 W Main submitted an application for doors, all three of these items passed. 419 S First the property owner is refinishing the carriage house and originally requested for tin siding on the sides and the back but came back and requested to change it to vinyl, the committee agreed and stated that it would blend better with the building. 20 Mill St the property owner requested to demo the house but they did not have any proof of structural damage or any other reason as to why it should be removed.
- I. **Fire District Report-** Brooks reported the audit is complete and preliminary results have been received and are being reviewed. Brooks is looking for ideas on how to communicate the \$500 cost for having the fire department come to your house for things such as; having a burn barrel without calling it in, have a fire pit and your neighbors call, or if you have a gas leak and they need to come out an inspect.

#### SUMMARY OF THE PROJECT

The project covered by this assessment report is on South 1<sup>st</sup> Street from West Liberty Street to Old Hwy 92, South 2<sup>nd</sup> Street from West Liberty Street to Old Hwy 92, and the intersection of West Fair Street and Longfield Street. This report also includes the sidewalk and driveway replacement project on Main Street from 5<sup>th</sup> Street to Maple Street and Maple Street from East Main Street to Water Street and the intersection reconstruction at South 6<sup>th</sup> Street and Badger Drive. The work on these projects will include concrete curb and gutter reconstruction, sidewalk and driveway reconstruction, street reconstruction and a new asphalt surface. Concrete sidewalk will be replaced as necessary to eliminate damaged and heaved sections along both sides and constructed where none exist prior. Work will also include sanitary sever replacement, water main replacement, and storm sewer improvements on South 1<sup>st</sup> Street and South 2<sup>nd</sup> Street. Storm sewer repairs will be constructed as necessary, though the existing drainage patterns will not be modified.

The work is combined with other improvements to a City owned multi-use path. Those other improvements are not being assessed and are not included in this report. The improvement of the actual street surface and underground utility construction are paid for by the City from general fund monies. Sidewalk and curb & gutter and the work items necessary to blend new sidewalk and curb & gutter to the existing yards and driveways will be assessed to the property owners. The plans, specifications and bidding documents which cover this work are under separate cover and are available at City Hall.

The benefited properties along 1<sup>st</sup> Street, 2<sup>nd</sup> Street and Fair Street are shown on schedule A of the following pages. Benefited properties along Main Street and Maple Street are schedule B and Badger Drive intersection are shown on schedule C. Following the listing of the benefited properties is a narrative description of the basis for assessments.

## BASIS FOR ASSESSMENTS

Curb & gutter is a direct benefit to adjacent properties, because it provides for efficient drainage of runoff onto street right-of-way, without ditches which are troublesome to mow, particularly during wet periods. It avoids "rutting" of wheel paths from vehicles which may park on the street frontages during wet soil conditions and the ponding areas which result from such wheel ruts. It provides a clean, visually pleasing line of demarcation between the traveled portion of the street and adjacent vegetated areas. Assessments are made on a front foot basis for curb & gutter, that is, the assessable cost of all of the sidewalk, curb & gutter and all restoration (blending) between the curb & gutter and the existing yards, driveways and sidewalks is added up and assessed to the property served by that section of sidewalk and curb & gutter. A lineal foot basis for curb & gutter benefits to adjacent properties, such benefits being drainage, appearance and longevity of adjacent surfaces. Costs for curb & gutter and sidewalk within intersections are not assessed to any property.

The City of Evansville assessment policy is that 50% of the costs of curb & gutter and sidewalk and 100% for driveways will be charged to the property owners abutting the improvements on the basis of front footage. Two-sided lots receive the same rate for each side. Storm sewer and drainage swales and appurtenances are not assessed. Curb & gutter and sidewalk that must be replaced due to sanitary sewer, storm sewer, or water main improvements is not assessed.

Assessments for curb & gutter are made for 50% of the cost of excavation, new concrete curb & gutter, base course beneath and to one foot behind the curb & gutter, and restoration of all vegetated and paved areas behind the curb which must be disturbed to properly blend curb & gutter to the existing features.

Assessments for sidewalk are made for 50% of the cost for excavation, new concrete sidewalk, base course beneath the sidewalk, and restoration of all adjacent vegetated and paved areas which must be disturbed to properly blend the sidewalk to existing features.

Assessments for driveways are made for 100% of the cost for excavation, new concrete sidewalk, base course beneath the driveway, and restoration of all adjacent vegetated and paved areas which must be disturbed to properly blend the driveways to existing features.

In some areas residents may choose to also replace additional sidewalk and driveways. These areas will only be reconstructed at the homeowner's request and 100% of the associated costs will be assessed to that particular property owner.

The entire project was walked in the Fall of 2020 to identify curb and sidewalk that would need replacement, and would be assessed to the fronting property owner. It is possible that some concrete has become damaged due to freeze/thaw cycles or other reasons, and would warrant replacement (and assessment) prior to the project commencing. For the purposes of the preliminary assessment report, every property on South 1<sup>st</sup> Street, South 2<sup>nd</sup> Street and Fair Street project is being shown to require at least 15 lineal feet of curb & gutter and sidewalk replacement and 50 square feet of driveway replacement. On the Main Street and Maple Street sidewalk project and Badger intersection, a minimum of 15 linear feet of sidewalk was used for the affected properties. This is also to account for variations from the Fall of 2020 to now. Final assessable amounts will be determined by re-inspecting the project prior to construction beginning and determining exactly which lengths of curb & gutter and sidewalk replacement will be assessable. The assessable improvements are being constructed as a part of a street improvements project. Plans & specifications for the project are available at City Hall.

### CITY OF EVANSVILLE RESOLUTION #2021-05

# A Preliminary Resolution Declaring Intent to Levy Special Assessments Under Municipal Police Power Pursuant to §66.0703.

WHEREAS, there is a benefit to the public that sidewalks and curbs are safe and functional; and

WHEREAS, there is a benefit to the public that water services are not lead or galvanized steel, and

WHEREAS, the replacement of such infrastructure can provide a financial and personal benefit to the adjacent property owner or occupant, and

WHEREAS, in favor of the public's interest, that portion of private benefit shall be assessed.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Evansville, Wisconsin:

1. The Common Council hereby declares its intention to exercise its police power under §66.0703, Stats., to levy special assessments upon property in the assessment district hereafter described for benefits conferred upon such property by reason of the following public work and improvements: <u>1<sup>st</sup> Street, & 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Badger Drive</u> Intersection, Wind Prairie Multi-Use Path, Maple Street & Main Street Sidewalk.

2. The property to be assessed lies within the following described assessment district: All property fronting upon both sides of South 1<sup>st</sup> Street from West Liberty Street to Old Hwy 92; South 2<sup>nd</sup> Street from West Liberty Street to Old Hwy 92; Main Street from 5<sup>th</sup> Street to Maple Street; Maple Street from E. Main Street to Water Street; Badger Drive southern frontage from S. 6<sup>th</sup> Street to approximately 280' east, and South 6<sup>th</sup> Street eastern frontage from Badger Drive to approximately 130' south.

3. The total amount assessed against the properties in the described assessment district shall not exceed:

a. 50% of the cost of the improvements to sidewalks and curb.

b. 100% of the driveway approaches from the street to the sidewalk

c. 100% voluntarily replaced private water service laterals that are lead or galvanized steel.

4. The Common Council determines that the improvements constitute an exercise of the police power for the health, safety and general welfare of the City of Evansville and its inhabitants.

5. The city engineer shall prepare a report which shall consist of:

a. Final plans and specifications for the improvements.

- b. An estimate of the entire cost of the proposed improvements.
- c. Schedule of proposed assessments.

6. When the report is completed, the city engineer shall file a copy of the report with the city clerk for public inspection and, if state property is to be assessed, shall mail a copy of the report to the responsible state agency and, for assessments of \$50,000 or more, to the Wisconsin state building commission.

7. Upon receiving the report of the city engineer, the clerk shall cause notice to be given stating the nature of the proposed improvements, the general boundary lines of the proposed assessment district, (including a small map thereof,) the time and place at which the report may be inspected, and the time and place of the public hearing on the matters contained in the preliminary resolution and the report. This notice shall be published as a class 1 notice under ch. 985, Stats, and a copy shall be mailed, at least 10 days before the hearing, to every interested party whose address is known or can be ascertained with reasonable diligence.

8. The hearing shall be held in the City of Evansville Council Chambers at the following address: 31 S Madison Street, Evansville, WI 53536, at a time set by the clerk in accordance with §66.0703, Stats. In response to COVID-19, this meeting is being held virtually to ensure the safety of members and the public. 9. Assessments shall be due within 30 days of billing date. Assessments may be paid in cash or in ten (10) annual installments. No such annual installment, except the final one, shall be less than \$50.00. Installments shall be placed on the next tax roll after the due date for collection and shall bear interest at the rate of 2.7% per annum on the unpaid balance (from due date). Installments or assessments not paid when due shall bear additional interest on the amount past due at the rate of 0.8% per annum.




Figure 2 Final Condominium Plat

## GENERAL CUSTODIAN POSITION DESCRIPTION

## **General Statement of Duties:**

The General Custodian - is responsible for the general maintenance and sanitation of all public buildings, grounds and other facilities City Hall and the Police Department.

## **Distinguishing Features of the Position:**

This position requires flexibility in skill sets, job assignment and applied time. This position is appointed by and reports to the Municipal Services Director and reports to the Public Works Foreman City Administrator. The primary service locations are the Police Station and City Hall.

## **Examples of work (illustrative only):**

## **Building Maintenance:**

- Performs light maintenance duties to public buildings including but not limited to; light bulb replacement, replacing switch/outlet plates, furnace filter replacements and check downspout placement.
- Is responsible for providing contractors and service representative's access to City buildings for the purpose of repair and inspection.
- Occasional projects like: sanding, staining and sealing of wood work, painting; or the replacement of accessible fixtures.

## **Grounds Maintenance:**

- Performs basic duties like mowing grass, removing snow, weed control, flower bed maintenance, washing buildings within historic maintenance guidelines on applicable buildings, and small paint jobs on outdoor facilities.
- Assists Public Works General Labors on applicable tasks as the schedule provides or during an emergency situation.

## **Sanitation**

- Removal of trash from assigned buildings on a set schedule
- Cleaning of floors through vacuuming and moping on a regular basis.
- Shampooing of carpet or heavy scrubbing/stripping and polishing of floors will be scheduled from time to time.
- Cleaning windows on a set schedule.
- Cleaning toilets, sinks, and urinals on a daily basis
- Sanitizing common areas like counter tops daily.
- Dust frequently, including the tops of appliances, shelves, air vents, exhaust fans, light fixtures and more.
- On a pre-arranged schedule with the occupant; deep cleaning offices including the moving of furniture, files, boxes and more
- Scheduled wiping of walls, doors and more.
- Order and restock cleaning supplies, stock sanitary supplies, replace hand towels, toilet paper as needed and replenish air fresheners.

## **Required Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities:**

- Ability to use small tools, including power tools.
- General knowledge of chemical handling and safety
- Knowledge on the use of custodial equipment like, but not limited to mops, floor scrubbers, carpet shampooers, vacuums, and dusters:
- Minimum of being able to obtain certification in CPR, AED operations and first-aid.

## Job standards (acceptable experience, training and education):

- Graduation from high school or GED equivalent.
- Any equivalent combination of the above experience, education, and training which provides the knowledge, skills and abilities required for this position and satisfy the job standards.
- Due to the access to the Police Station, the ability to pass a basic criminal background check and drug screen is required. Adherence to confidentiality is mandatory. Length of time and nature of any previous conviction shall be considered when determining eligibility.

## Work Environment:

Working occasionally in outside elements such as heat, cold, rain and sun. Potential for high levels of pollen, dust and other irritants. Standing, walking, working and driving around or within moving traffic. Working with potentially hazardous or flammable chemicals. The work environment characteristics described here are representative of those an employee encounters while performing the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions. The noise level in the work environment is moderately noisy.

## **Physical Demands:**

The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions. While performing the duties of this job, the employee is frequently required to use hands and arms. The employee is occasionally required to climb or balance; stoop, kneel, crouch, or crawl. The employee is required to walk, sit, and talk or hear. The employee may be required to lift, pull and/or move 50 pounds for extended periods occasionally. Must occasionally lift, pull and/or move 100 pounds with mechanical and/or physical assistance. Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, color vision, and the ability to adjust focus.

## **Selection guidelines:**

Formal applications, rating of education and experience, or an interview and reference check. Job related tests may be required.

The duties listed above are intended only as illustrations of the various types of work that may be performed. The omission of specific statements of duties does not exclude them from the position if the work is similar, related, or a logical assignment to the position.

The position description for the General Custodian does not constitute an employment agreement between the employer and employee and is subject to change by the employer as the needs of the employer and requirements of the job change. No individual City official has authority to enter into an oral or written promise or contract of employment with any individual or group of employees. Any employment contract must be approved by a majority of the Common Council.

## Choose Renewable Price Reduction – Member Action Requested by April 30

Contact: Tim Ament

If your utility participates in the WPPI membership's shared Choose Renewable program, please take local action by April 30 on recommended changes to reduce participation costs and make discounted pricing more accessible for your customers. Through Choose Renewable, interested customers of participating WPPI member utilities can buy 300-kilowatt-hour blocks of renewable energy to offset some or all of their monthly electric usage. In Wisconsin, updating such a program requires state approval. We made good progress on this front last week, when the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSCW) approved River Falls Municipal Utilities' request to change its renewable energy rider as follows.

 River Falls reduced its Choose Renewable pricing from \$3 to \$2 per block, passing lower program costs from WPPI through to local customers.

• River Falls customers purchasing 20 or more blocks per month now qualify for discounted pricing of \$1 per block. Previously, the volume discount threshold was 100 blocks.

The PSCW has agreed to streamline its process for other WPPI members requesting the same changes. Our rates staff will prepare the necessary filings, submitting as many as possible in mid-May to be processed as a single batch. With this timeline in mind, participating member utilities in Wisconsin are asked to begin work now to secure necessary local approvals by April 30. You may recall that last month, the PSCW similarly opened the door for expedited changes to WPPI members' New Load Market Pricing rates. To implement one or both of these changes for your utility, or if you need more information on the approval process, please contact Tim Ament.

## POLE ATTACHMENT AGREEMENT

This POLE ATTACHMENT AGREEMENT dated as of \_\_\_\_\_\_, 20\_\_\_\_, for the use of facilities is between the City of Evansville (hereinafter called "City"), and \_\_\_\_\_\_ (hereinafter called "Licensee").

## WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, City owns, operates, maintains, and controls certain electric power distribution poles (hereinafter "poles") within the City of Evansville, Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, Licensee proposed to place and maintain aerial cables, wires, related equipment reasonably necessary for the use of wire or aerial cables (hereinafter called "facilities" or "attachments"), and related equipment reasonably necessary to attach wire or aerial cables to City poles (hereinafter called "facilities" or "attachments") at specific locations in City's service area and desired to attach such facilities to poles or structures owned and maintained by the City; and

WHEREAS, City is willing to permit, to the extent it may lawfully do so, the attachment of Licensee's facilities to its poles on a non-exclusive basis, where safety will not be adversely affected and such use will not interfere with City's own service requirements and with the rights and privileges of other parties using City's poles;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing recitals and the covenants, terms and conditions hereinafter contained, the parties hereto do hereby mutually covenant and agree as follows:

## ARTICLE I

## Scope of Agreement

1.1 General Scope.

This Agreement shall be in effect and shall apply to all attachments made by Licensee to poles owned by City now existing or hereinafter erected and such poles are included within the scope of this Agreement in accordance with the procedures set forth below. City reserves the right to exclude use of its poles from joint use which, in the sole judgment of City would be unsafe or violate a rule, regulation, or good practice.

1.2 Rights of Parties.

The rights and privileges of Licensee shall be subject to the rights and privileges of others upon whom City has conferred contractual rights or privileges to use its poles prior to the execution of this Agreement, or predecessors to this Agreement.

1.3 Authorization.

Subject to the provisions of this Agreement, City agrees to grant to Licensee a license for the nonexclusive right to attach its facilities to certain designated City poles. No use of City

poles, however extended, or payment of fees or charges required under this Agreement, shall create or vest in Licensee any ownership of property rights in such poles. Licensee's rights herein shall be and remain a mere license for the duration of this Agreement.

1.4 Assignment.

Licensee may not assign its rights under this Agreement to any other person or entity without City's prior written consent, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.

1.5 Authorizations Required.

Licensee shall secure all authorizations permits and any other approvals required by any governmental authority or private entity for the construction, operation, and maintenance of its facilities.

## ARTICLE II

## Definitions

2.1 For purposes of this Agreement, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

2.1.1 Pole means an electrical power distribution pole owned and maintained by City.

2.1.2 Pole Contact or Attachment means any and each wire, cable or other equipment or apparatus, including a service drop contact, attached directly or indirectly to a City pole.

## ARTICLE III

## Reservation of Primary Use

3.1 Primary City Use.

City specifically reserves its right to maintain its own facilities and to operate its own equipment thereon in such a manner as will best enable it to fulfill its own service requirements. City shall not be liable to Licensee for any interruption of Licensee's service or for any interference with the operation of Licensee's facilities in any manner except by gross negligence of City.

## ARTICLE IV

## Application for Attachment

4.1 Permit Application.

Except as set forth herein, Licensee shall not attach any of its facilities to City's poles without first making written or electronic application to City for a permit and receiving written or electronic permission from City in the form of a permit. For the purposes of this Agreement,

Licensee's facilities shall include only wire or fiber cables, related equipment reasonably necessary for the use of wire or fiber cables, and that equipment reasonably necessary to attach wire or fiber cables on City poles. Under this agreement, Licensee's facilities shall not include Wi-Fi equipment or any other device used for the provision of wireless internet, wireless phone service, or an antenna of any kind.

4.2 Application Procedure.

Whenever Licensee desires to attach its facilities to any City pole, Licensee shall make application for a permit using a Pole Attachment Application Form specified by City. As part of the application process, the applicant shall also complete an application for a right of way permit, paying the application fee as set forth in the then existing City of Evansville fee schedule. If, in City's sole judgment, the poles are necessary for City's own use, or if the requested attachment or modification under the circumstances is undesirable, City shall have the right to deny or request modification of the application.

4.2.1 The application shall include sufficient design drawings, specifications and instructions so that qualified personnel can safely make the attachments in conformity with code, regulation and good practice.

4.2.2 If the application is approved, Licensee shall have the right to affix such attachments in accordance with the application, as approved, in compliance with the specifications, terms, and conditions of this Agreement, in compliance with all applicable ordinances, statutes, codes, rules, regulations, and in conformity with good utility practice.

4.2.3 City, upon receipt of an application, may contact the applicant to schedule an evaluation "ride out" with personnel from Licensee and City. For all ride outs, appropriately qualified personnel representing Licensee and City representative shall meet at the location of the proposed attachment to determine if the attachment or modification can be made, and to review technical requirements.

4.3 Installation; Certification.

Each application shall involve sufficient planning by Licensee to assure compliance with ordinances, statues, codes, rules, regulations and good practice during construction and upon completion.

4.3.1 Licensee shall only use trained, qualified persons to work on all pole installations. Qualified persons shall be knowledgeable in applicable ordinance, statute, code, rules, regulations and good practice and must be able to demonstrate competence in recognizing and preventing any ordinance, statute, code, rules, regulation and good practice violations and to keep working clearances from energized lines and equipment.

4.3.2 Upon completion of the installation, Licensee shall give written

certification to City that the facilities are complete and comply with ordinances, statutes, codes, rules, regulations and good practices. If the installation is found to be in violation of any applicable standards noted above, or if there are deviations from the original design specifications, City will make Licensee aware that corrections must be made within thirty (30) days. If Licensee does not make corrections in thirty (30) days, City will make the corrections at Licensee's expense. If corrections are unable to be made, the attachment shall be removed.

4.4 Make Ready Work; Charges.

Whenever any City facility must be modified to accommodate any proposed attachment, City will provide Licensee with a detailed estimate of "make ready" work it determines is necessary to prepare the pole for Licensee's facilities. After receiving this estimate, if Licensee still desires to make such attachments, Licensee shall notify City within fifteen (15) days of receiving such estimate of such continuing desire to attach, and shall pay to City within 30 days of the commencement of said make-ready work any required payment for engineering, materials (including poles and associated hardware), cost of removal (less any salvage value), and the expense of transferring City's facilities from the old to the new poles. City shall commence all requested make ready and pole replacement work within thirty (30) days of receiving any work request confirmation.

4.5 Non-Interference with City Facilities.

Licensee shall at all times insure that its agents, servants, employees or contractors or contractor's employees do not interfere with City's wires, attachments, and other facilities attached to or supported by poles covered by this Agreement. Each party shall exercise reasonable precautions to avoid damage to the facilities of the other. Without limiting the foregoing, Licensee's attachment design shall allow adequate climbing space for City personnel.

4.6 Changes or Modifications to Existing Attachment.

Licensee shall not make any changes or modifications to an existing attachment that result in an increase in the height of the pole, or that increase the weight or location of attachments on the pole without having the express written permission from City. Licensee shall make application to City for modifications as provided in Article IV.

## ARTICLE V

## Unauthorized Attachments

5.1 Unauthorized Attachments.

If attachment is made without permission and/or without following a procedure which is substantially in accordance with this Agreement, such attachment shall constitute an "Unauthorized Attachment".

#### 5.2 Application for Unauthorized Attachments.

City may, without prejudice to its other rights or remedies under this Agreement, require Licensee to submit a Pole Attachment Application within thirty (30) days after the date of written or electronic notification from City to Licensee of an Unauthorized Attachment. If such application is not received by City within the specified time period, Licensee shall immediately remove said Unauthorized Attachment. In the event the Unauthorized Attachment creates an emergency or safety hazard, the City may remove Unauthorized Attachments without liability, and the expense of such removal shall be borne by Licensee.

#### 5.3 Failure to Act.

No act or failure to act by City with regard to Section 5.2 shall be deemed a ratification or grant of permission to Licensee to attach the Unauthorized Attachment. If any permission is subsequently issued, said permission shall not operate retroactively or constitute a waiver by City of any of its rights under this Agreement; provided, however, that Licensee shall be subject to all charges, liabilities, obligations and responsibilities of this Agreement in regard to any unauthorized attachment.

#### ARTICLE VI

#### Identification of Facilities

#### 6.1 Identification of Facilities.

Licensee shall identify, by such method as the City must approve, all of their facilities attached to City's poles. This identification shall begin with new attachments when this Agreement is signed. No tag, brand, or other device showing Licensee's name or insignia shall be placed on, or attached to, any pole of City, except such tag or insignia which shows Licensee to be a user of such pole and not the owner thereof, and then only after obtaining the written consent of City.

#### ARTICLE VII

#### Easements and Rights of Way

#### 7.1 No Warranty.

City does not warrant or assure to Licensee any right of way privilege or easements or that City owns a property right which permits attachment, and if Licensee shall at any time be prevented from placing or maintaining its attachment on City's poles, no liability shall attach to City. Each party shall be responsible for obtaining its own easements and rights of way. The attaching Licensee shall solely be responsible to acquire the property right to attach from any property owner.

#### ARTICLE VIII

#### Maintenance, Replacements, Relocations and Removals

#### 8.1 Inspection of Facilities.

Licensee shall comply with all applicable ordinances, statutes, codes, rules, regulations and good practices regarding inspection of their facilities. City shall have the right to inspect each installation of Licensee's facilities upon and in the vicinity of such poles and to make periodic inspections of Licensee's facilities, as it deems necessary. Such inspections, whether made or not, shall in no manner relieve Licensee of any responsibility, obligation, or liability assumed under this Agreement.

#### 8.2 Pole Relocation.

Whenever right-of-way, safety public regulations, or other considerations arise other than as provided in Section IV herein, make relocation of a pole necessary or advisable, such relocation shall be made by City at its own expense, except each party shall pay the cost of transferring its own attachments.

#### 8.3 Relocation of Facilities.

8.3.1 Whenever it is necessary in City's sole judgment to replace or relocate a pole, City shall, except in emergencies, before making such replacement or relocation, give Licensee thirty (30) days notice thereof specifying in such notice the time of such replacement or relocation. In an emergency, verbal or electronic notice will be attempted (*except after hours emergencies for which no notice is required*), and any emergency action taken will be subsequently confirmed in writing.

8.3.2 Placement of relocated poles shall be at the sole operational discretion of City, although where possible consideration shall be given to a pole placement that results in the least cost to City and Licensee. Notwithstanding this section, City shall not be liable to Licensee for the cost of relocating its facilities on a replaced or relocated pole. Each party shall bear the cost of transferring its own attachments.

8.3.3. City shall provide Licensee with written or electronic notification at such time as sufficient work has been completed to allow the transfer of Licensee's facilities. Licensee shall transfer its attachments within thirty (30) days of said notification, except where Licensee's failure to immediately transfer said facilities creates an emergency or safety hazard. Should Licensee fail to transfer its attachments to the new or relocated pole in the time specified, or if the failure to immediately transfer Licensee's facilities, and Licensee shall pay City the cost thereof. In the event Licensee fails to transfer its attachments and City does such work, City shall not be liable for any loss or damage, including incidental and consequential damages or lost revenues to Licensee's facilities or business which may result.

8.4 Condition of Attachments.

Except as otherwise provided, each party shall at all times maintain all of its property and attachments in accordance this Agreement, and shall keep them in good repair.

8.5 Non-Conformance with Specifications.

Should the City discover, at any time, an attachment that is permitted, but otherwise in violation of the terms and conditions of this agreement, including an attachment that may have been conforming at one time but subsequently violates any of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, the City shall notify Licensee, and excepting emergency and/or safety situations, Licensee shall cure the non-conformity within thirty (30) days after the date of such written or electronic notification. In those situations where Licensee's failure to conform to the terms and conditions of this agreement is deemed by the City to result in an emergency and or safety hazard, the City may immediately remove Licensee's facilities at Licensee's sole risk and expense. Nothing in this section shall require Licensee to conform existing attachments to new or revised code specifications where the applicable code does not so require.

8.6 Licensee Assumption of Responsibility.

Licensee expressly assumes responsibility for determining the condition of all poles to be climbed by its employees, contractors, or employees of contractors. City disclaims any warranty or representation regarding the condition and safety of the poles of City. Licensee's employees or contractors shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that a pole is safe to be used or climbed upon and in the event of doubt, shall not proceed and shall seek reasonable assistance. Regardless of whether contact has been made by City or not, any pole that is marked with an orange "X" is deemed unsafe to climb or have any objects, such as a ladder, leaned up against it.

8.7 Replacement of Deteriorated Poles Without Attachments.

Should City replace any poles because of deterioration or the requirements of public authorities or property owners, or in City's sole judgment for the benefit of its system, and should Licensee desire to occupy the new pole, Licensee shall reimburse City for the cost of any increment of pole height or strength provided specifically for Licensee's sole requirements over and above the pole height and strength required by City.

8.8 Increased Pole Space Requirements.

Should City replace any poles because of increased requirements of more than one pole occupant, including Licensee, Licensee shall be responsible for its transfer costs from the old pole to the new pole and for the costs of City on a pro rata basis with other pole licensees. In any case where facilities of City or of others are required to be rearranged on the poles of City to accommodate the attachments of Licensee, Licensee shall pay to City the

total cost incurred by City in rearranging such facilities. In any case where Licensee's facilities are required to be rearranged to accommodate the attachments of a third-party, City shall first notify the third party of the existence of Licensee's facilities and shall require proof from the third-party attacher that satisfactory arrangements have been made with Licensee for reimbursement of any expense occasioned by the third-party's request.

8.9 Noninterference with City Circuits.

Licensee expressly agrees that City's circuits are to continue in normal operation during Licensee's performance of any construction or maintenance, and that Licensee is to provide and use all protective equipment necessary for the protection of the public, the City, and Licensee's employees, contractors, and equipment, and Licensee shall guard against interference with normal operation of City's circuits.

#### ARTICLE IX

## Abandonment of Poles and Removal of Attachments

#### 9.1 Notice.

Licensee may at any time remove its facilities from any of City's poles and, in such case, Licensee shall immediately give City written or electronic notice of such removal identifying from what locations and on what date equipment was removed. Removal of said facilities from any of Citys poles shall constitute a termination of Licensee's privilege to use such poles.

#### 9.2 Pole Abandonment

If City desires at any time to abandon any pole(s), it shall give Licensee notice in writing or in electronic form to that effect at least thirty (30) days prior to the date on which it intends to abandon such pole(s). If Licensee desires to maintain its attachments, then Licensee shall notify City and City shall, when feasible, negotiate in good faith mutually acceptable terms and conditions for the sale of the pole(s) to Licensee. If Licensee does not desire to maintain its attachments, then Licensee shall remove its attachments prior to the date on which City intends to abandon the pole(s). If, at the expiration of such notice period, Licensee has not removed all of its attachments from such poles, City may remove Licensee's attachments and charge Licensee a reasonable fee for such removal.

9.2.1 Should Licensee buy the pole, as specified herein, Licensee agrees and understands that it shall assume total responsibility for, and hold City harmless therefrom, maintenance, replacement and/or disposal requirements mandated by local, state and/or federal law. Licensee recognizes and acknowledges that it is taking title to the pole for all purposes. Licensee further recognizes and acknowledges that utility poles and related items may contain various hazardous chemicals or properties and that Licensee shall become

familiar with the terms of the appropriate material safety data sheet and agrees to comply with such terms and all directions contained therein or otherwise required by local, state and/or federal law regarding the maintenance, replacement and/or disposal of the pole. Licensee also understands the City does not warrant, guarantee or imply that such poles possess sufficient mechanical strength as required by any use of Licensee. Additionally, Licensee agrees and understands the City makes no representations or guarantees concerning any right to occupy the premises where the pole is currently located upon the removal of City's facilities.

#### ARTICLE X

#### Fees, Charges and Rates

#### 10.1 Pole Attachment Rate.

Licensee shall pay to City pole attachment fees on an annual basis, in accordance with the fee schedule established by the Common Council from time to time. Pole attachment fees shall be calculated on a per-pole basis, for any attachments existing as of December 31. There shall be no pro-rating of pole attachment fees for partial years.

#### 10.2 Billings.

Annual invoices shall be rendered on or about October 1 of each year based on the number of City poles with Licensee attachments existing as of December 31 of the prior year. Invoices shall be considered delinquent if not paid within thirty (30) days of the billing date. Nonpayment of any amount due under this Section shall constitute a default of this Agreement if such amount remains unpaid thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice of such nonpayment. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the event of a bona fide dispute regarding the amount owed by Licensee, Licensee shall promptly pay any amounts undisputed from the total billing.

10.3 Pole Inventory.

Licensee shall annually tabulate the total number of Licensee attachments on City poles, prior to October 1 of each year, and shall certify the same to the City as true, correct, and complete.

#### 10.4 Physical Inventory.

Licensee and City shall maintain a physical inventory of total Licensee attachments and all future pole attachment fees shall be based on such physical inventory. City shall have the right to conduct a physical inventory of Licensee's attachments on City poles. Licensee shall notify City if Licensee chooses to have a representative present during the inventory process. A physical inventory shall be taken no more frequently than once every five (5) years; provided, however, that City may request and require a physical inventory to be taken more frequently in the event of a default by Licensee in the performance of its obligations hereunder.

#### 10.5 Inventory from Plant Records.

As an alternative to performance of the physical inventory, the parties may, if mutually agreeable, determine the number of attachments from existing maps and/or attachment records provided that such maps or records exist and provided that each party agrees that results with reasonable accuracy can be achieved. If the parties agree to this method, any maps and/or records belonging to one of the parties and utilized to count attachments shall be made accessible to the other party and the number of attachments shall be determined through a mutual and cooperative effort of both parties. The results of attachment fees and other charges due for unauthorized attachments, as if results were achieved by the actual physical inventory.

#### 10.6 Payment.

Unless specifically provided for elsewhere in this Agreement, all non-fee attachment amounts payable under this Agreement, such as for erection, rearrangement, relocation or abandonment, shall be due and payable within thirty (30) days of billing by City.

#### ARTICLE XI

#### Safety

#### 11.1 Inspections.

City shall have the right to inspect each new installation of Licensee's facilities upon and in the vicinity of such poles and to make periodic inspections as it deems reasonably necessary. Such inspections, whether made or not, shall in no manner relieve Licensee of any responsibility, obligation, or liability assumed under this Agreement. The frequency of periodic inspections is dependent on the performance of Licensee in conforming to the terms of this Agreement.

#### 11.2 Conflicts with Electric Lines.

City shall provide Licensee notice of any ordinance, statute, code, rule or regulation violation it discovers. Ordinance, statute, code, rule or regulation violations and conflicts with electric lines shall be corrected in a prompt manner by Licensee if Licensee created the violation. In some instances, ordinances, statutes, codes, rules, or regulations may require that qualified electrical workers perform the work. In that event, Licensee shall either hire qualified contractors or pay City to perform the work. Failure by Licensee to act in a prompt and responsible manner may result in City taking appropriate measures to correct the safety violations involved and Licensee shall be responsible for the cost thereof. In such cases, the inspection, design, repair, and coordination charges shall be borne by Licensee if it failed to perform necessary duties required by ordinance, statute, code, or administrative rules and regulations.

#### ARTICLE XII

#### 12.1 Duty of Care; Reimbursement for Damages.

Each party shall exercise precautions to avoid causing damage to the other party's poles, facilities and equipment, and shall assume all responsibility for such damage to the extent said damages were caused by the party's negligence or intentional conduct. In the event damage is caused, the responsible party shall make an immediate report of the occurrence to the other party and shall reimburse the other party under this section no later than thirty (30) days from the occurrence of damages.

#### ARTICLE XIII

#### Third Party Uses

13.1 Noninterference.

Nothing contained herein shall be construed as affecting any rights or privileges conferred by City, by contract or otherwise, to others not a party to this Agreement to use any facilities or poles covered by this Agreement. City shall have the right to continue to extend such rights and privileges. The privileges granted herein to Licensee shall at all times be subject to any such contracts and arrangements, including extensions thereof. Should any other party claim a prior right covered by this Agreement, and such claim be upheld by a court of proper jurisdiction, Licensee shall make no claim against City for damages, or otherwise, on account thereof.

#### ARTICLE XIV

#### Indemnification and Insurance

#### 14.1 Indemnification.

Subject to any contrary positions herein, each party shall indemnify, protect, save harmless the other party from and against any and all claims and demands of any kind or nature arising out of or relating to this agreement for damages to property and for injury or death to persons, (including payments made under any Workers' Compensation Law or under any plan for employees' disability and death benefits), sustained as a consequence of that party's negligence or intentional conduct, including any claims or damages for failure to acquire a property right or have authority to attach or permit attachment to City's poles. Such obligation to indemnify, protect, save harmless and insure shall include, but not be limited to all expenses incurred in defending against any such claims or demands, including attorneys' fees, expert fees and other costs of defense. 14.2 Insurance Requirements.

While this Agreement is in effect Licensee shall carry and keep in force insurance policies with a reliable company in a form satisfactory to City to protect the parties from and against any and all claims, demands, actions, judgments, costs, expenses and liabilities of every kind and nature which may arise or result directly or indirectly from Licensee's activities under this Agreement which policies shall be in amounts no less than the following minimum requirements:

14.2.1 Commercial general liability insurance (including coverage for motor vehicle operation) and independent contractors' insurance, with minimum limits of \$2 million each occurrence and \$5 million aggregate, including coverage for contractual liability insurance. City shall be a named insured on said policy.

14.2.2 Workers' compensation insurance in compliance with the laws of the State of Wisconsin, and employer's liability insurance with minimum limits of \$500,000.

14.2.3 Licensee shall furnish City with certificates of insurance showing that such insurance is in force and will not be canceled or modified without thirty (30) days prior written notice to the City Administrator or his/her designee. Copies of the underlying policies and endorsements shall be provided for inspection within thirty (30) days of request. In the alternative, Licensee shall demonstrate to the satisfaction of City that it is self-insured and that any deductible, self-insured retention or other financial responsibility for claims shall be covered directly by Licensee in lieu of insurance.

#### ARTICLE XV

#### Term of Agreement

15.1 Five Year Term; Termination.

This Agreement shall become effective as of the year and date first written above and shall continue in effect for a term of five (5) years, subject to annual rate revisions pursuant to Section 10.1. Thereafter, this Agreement shall automatically renew from year to year unless terminated by either party by giving written notice of its intention to do so not less than 90 days prior to the end of any term. Upon termination of this Agreement, the terms of this Agreement shall continue to apply to Licensee's Pole Attachments and service drop contacts in place on City poles as of the termination date, unless and until a successor agreement has been executed.

15.2 Survival of Obligations.

Termination of this Agreement in whole or in part shall not release the parties from any liability or obligation hereunder, whether of indemnity or otherwise, which may have accrued or which may be accruing or which arises out of any claim that may have accrued or be accruing at the time of or prior to termination.

#### ARTICLE XVI

#### Default

#### 16.1 Notice of Default; Cure

Except as otherwise specified in Sections 4.4, 5.2, 8.3, 8.5, 9.2, 10.2, and 10.6 herein, if Licensee shall fail to comply with any material provision of this Agreement or should default in any of its obligations under this Agreement, and Licensee shall fail within thirty (30) days after written notice from City to correct or undertake to correct with reasonable diligence such noncompliance or default, City may, at its option, and without further notice, declare this Agreement to be terminated in its entirety, or may terminate the license covering the attachment or attachments in respect to which such default or noncompliance shall have occurred. Excepting safety and/or code related defaults, if the default is of such a nature that it cannot be corrected within thirty (30) days, Licensee's obligation hereunder is satisfied if Licensee within thirty (30) days and submits in writing a reasonable plan and work schedule and commitment to finish the correction promptly.

#### ARTICLE XVII

#### **Ownership Rights**

#### 17.1 License Only.

No use, however extended, of any of the facilities under this Agreement shall create or vest in Licensee any ownership or property rights therein, but Licensee's rights therein shall be and remain a mere license.

#### ARTICLE XVIII

#### Notices

18.1 Delivery.

Unless otherwise provided in this Agreement, any notice, request, consent, demand or statement which is contemplated to be made upon either party by the other party under any of the provisions of this Agreement, shall be in writing and shall be treated as duly delivered when it is either (a) personally delivered to the City Clerk in the case of notice to be given to City, or personally delivered to the office of Licensee in the case of notice to be given to Licensee; or (b) deposited in the United States Mail and properly addressed to the party to be served as follows:

#### ARTICLE XIX

#### Supplemental Agreements

19.1 Changes.

This Agreement may be amended or supplemented only upon written agreement by the parties hereto.

#### ARTICLE XX

#### Payment of Taxes

20.1 Each party shall pay all taxes and assessments lawfully levied on its own property upon City's poles.

20.2 Licensee agrees that if any tax, fee or charge is levied against City solely due to Licensee's equipment or facilities being on City's poles, Licensee will reimburse City the full amount of said tax, fee, or charge.

#### ARTICLE XXI

#### **Supplying Information**

#### 21.1 Changes.

Licensee shall promptly report to City any changes made in the number of Licensee's attachments to City's poles.

#### ARTICLE XXII

#### Waiver of Terms or Conditions

22.1 Waiver.

The failure of either party to enforce or insist upon compliance with any of the terms or conditions of this Agreement shall not constitute a general waiver or relinquishment of any such terms or conditions, but such conditions and terms shall remain at all times in full force and effect.

#### ARTICLE XXIIII

#### Construction of Agreement

23.1 Wisconsin Law Shall Apply.

This Agreement is deemed executed in the State of Wisconsin and shall be construed under the laws of the State of Wisconsin.

23.2 Venue for Litigation.

In the event suit or action is instituted to enforce or interpret any of the terms of this Agreement, the parties agree that proper venue for said action or suit shall lie in the Circuit Court, County of Rock, State of Wisconsin.

#### ARTICLE XXIV

24.1 Compliance with Laws and Administrative Rules.

Licensee agrees that, in the performance of this Agreement, Licensee shall comply with and be subject to all federal, state and local governmental rules and regulations.

#### ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

#### **Division 1 – Generally**

#### Sec. 6-1. Adoption of state law.

The provisions of Wis. Stats. Ch. 125 defining, describing and regulating the sale, procurement, dispensing, consumption and transfer of alcohol beverages, including provisions relating to underage persons, are adopted and made a part of this section by reference. Violation of any such provisions shall constitute a violation of this section. Penalties for violations by or relating to sale, procurement, dispensing or transfer to underage persons shall strictly conform to the penalties imposed for violations of identical offenses defined and described in Wis. Stats. Ch. 125, adopted in this section.

If a class A license, between 9:00 p.m. Saturday evening and 6:00 a.m. on Sunday, and on weekdays between 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. the next day, provided this subsection shall not prohibit drugstores holding such class A license from remaining open on Sundays and beyond the hours set forth in this subsection for the conduct of business other than that provided for by such class A license.

(2) -Class B license.

a. –If a class B license, on Saturdays and Sundays between 2:30 a.m. and 6:00 a.m., and on weekdays between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. On January 1, premises operating under a class B license are not required to close. No package, container or bottle sales may be made after midnight.

b. –This subsection shall not prohibit restaurants, bowling alleys or similar establishments holding class B licenses from remaining open beyond the hours set forth for the conduct of business other than that provided for by such class B license.

(3) **\_Christmas Eve.** No person having a class A license shall sell or dispense liquor or fermented malt beverages after 6:00 p.m. on Christmas Eve.

(g) –**Violations by agents or employees.** A violation of this section, section 6-1, or article II, division 1 of this chapter by an authorized agent or employee of a licensee shall constitute a violation by the licensee.

#### Sec. 6-3. Consumption in public place.

No person shall drink or carry for the purpose of immediate consumption in any container an alcohol beverage upon the streets, sidewalks, parks, public parking lots, public buildings or public school property within the city.

### Division 2 – Hosting Gatherings Involving Underage Possession and Consumption of Alcohol

#### Sec 6-4 Purpose and Finding.

The City Council of the City of Evansville, Wisconsin intends to discourage underage possession and consumption of alcohol, even if done within the confines of a private residence, and intends to hold persons civilly responsible who host events or gatherings where persons under 21 years of age possess or consume alcohol or consume alcohol regardless of whether the person hosting the event or gathering supplied the alcohol. The City Council of Evansville finds:

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Formatted: Indent: Left: 0.5" Formatted: Font: Bold, Not Italic Formatted: Font: Bold Formatted: Font: Bold, Not Italic Events and gatherings held on private or public property where alcohol is possessed or consumed by persons under the age of twenty-one are harmful to those persons and constitute a potential threat to public health requiring prevention or abatement.

Prohibiting hosting underage consumption acts to protect underage persons, as well as the general public, from injuries related to alcohol consumption, such as alcohol overdose or alcohol-related traffic collisions.

Alcohol is an addictive drug which, when used irresponsibly, does have drastic effects on those who use it as well as those who are affected by the actions of an irresponsible user.

Often, events or gatherings involving underage possession and consumption occur outside the presence of parents. However, there are times when the parent(s) is/are present and condone the activity, and in some circumstances, provide the alcohol.

A deterrent effect is created by holding a person responsible for hosting an event or gathering where underage possession or consumption occurs.

#### Sec 6-5 Definitions.

For purposes of this division, the following terms have the following meanings:

(a) <u>Alcohol. "Alcohol."</u> means ethyl alcohol, hydrated oxide of ethyl, or spirits of wine, whiskey, rum, brandy, gin or any other distilled spirits including dilutions and mixtures thereof from whatever source or by whatever process produced.

(b) <u>Alcoholic Beverage. "Alcoholic Beverage</u>" means alcohol, spirits, liquor, wine, beer and every liquid or solid containing alcohol, spirits, wine or beer, and which contains one-half of one percent or more of alcohol by volume and which is fit for beverage purposes either alone or when diluted, mixed or combined with other substances.

(c) <u>Event or Gathering, "Event or Gathering</u>" means any group of two or more persons who have assembled or gathered together for a social occasion or other activity.

(d) <u>Host or Allow.</u>"<u>Host" or "Allow"</u> means to aid, conduct, entertain, organize, supervise, control or permit a gathering or event.

(e) Parent. "<u>Parent</u>" means any person having legal custody of a juvenile:

As natural, adoptive parent or step-parent As a legal guardian; or As a person to whom legal custody has been given by order of the Court

(f) Residence, Premises or Public or Private Property. "<u>Residence", "Premises",</u> <u>or "Public or Private Property"</u> means any home, yard, farm, field, land, apartment, condominium, hotel or motel room or other dwelling unit, or a hall or meeting room, park Formatted: Font: Italic, Underline

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or any other place of assembly, whether occupied on a temporary or permanent basis, whether occupied as a dwelling or specifically for a party or other social function, and whether owned, leased, rented or used with or without permission or compensation.

(g) <u>Underage Person.</u> <u>Underage Person</u> means a person who has not attained the legal drinking age.

(h) Present. "Present" means being at hand or in attendance.

(i) In Control. "<u>In control</u>" means the power to direct, manage, oversee and/or restrict the affairs, business or assets of a person or entity.

(j) <u>Class A- means sale for consumption off the premises. Examples: Liquor stores</u>, grocery stores or convenience stores. See (Sec. 125.25, Wis. Stats.) & (Sec. 125.51(2), Wis. Stats.) for more details.

(k) <u>*Class B-*</u> means for consumption on or off premises. Examples: Restaurants, bars or taverns. See (Sec. 125.26, Wis. Stats.) & (Secs. 125.51(3), 125.51(3r), Wis. Stats.) for more details

#### [(Ord. 2012-17, Ord. 2021-03)]

#### Sec 6-6 Prohibited Acts.

It is unlawful for any person(s) to: host or allow an event or gathering at any residence, premises or on any other private or public property where alcohol or alcoholic beverages are present when the person knows that an underage person will or does (i) consume any alcohol or alcoholic beverage; or (ii) possess any alcohol or alcoholic beverage with the intent to consume it; and the person fails to take reasonable steps to prevent possession or consumption by the underage person(s).

(a)—\_\_\_A person is in violation of this section if the person intentionally aids, advises, hires, counsels or conspires with or otherwise procures another to commit the prohibited act.

(b)—\_\_\_\_\_A person who hosts an event or gathering does not have to be present at the event or gathering to be responsible.

#### Sec 6-7 Exceptions.

(a)—\_\_\_This division does not apply in cases where a person procures for, sells, dispenses of or gives away alcohol beverage to an underage person in the direct company of his or her parent, guardian or spouse who has attained the legal drinking age, who has consented to the underage person acquiring or consuming the alcohol beverages and is in a position to observe and control the underage person.

(b)—\_\_\_This division does not apply to legally protected religious observances.

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(c)—\_\_\_This division does not apply to situations where underage persons are lawfully in possession of alcohol or alcoholic beverages during the course and scope of employment.

#### Sec 6-8 Penalties.

An adult who violates any provision of this section must appear in municipal court and is subject to the following penalties:

(a) A forfeiture of not more than \$500 if the adult has not committed a previous violation within 30 months of the violation.

(b) Fined not more than \$500 if the adult has committed a previous violation within 30 months of the violation.

(c) Fined not more than \$1,000 if the adult has committed two previous violations within 30 months of the violation.

(d) Fined not more than \$10,000 if the adult has committed three or more previous violations within 30 months of the violation.

By July 15 of each year, the Clerk-Treasurer shall forward to the State Department of Revenue a list containing the name, address and trade name of each person holding a license issued under this division, except a picnic, manager's or operator's license.

#### Sec. 6-34. Consent of applicant to future regulations and amendments.

By filing the application for a class A, B or C license under this division, the applicant consents that the council may make any rule or regulation or alteration or amendment to this chapter at any time during the period for which such license is granted.

Sec. 6-35. Restrictions on issuance of class A licenses.

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(a) –The number of "Class A" intoxicating liquor licenses which may be issued to persons or premises in the city is limited to one (1) for each seven-hundred (700) population in the city as defined by Wis. Stats. § 125.51(4). An application for a "Class A" liquor license shall not be favored or disfavored because the applicant already has been granted a Class "A" fermented malt beverage license.

(b) –A Class "A" fermented malt beverage license may be granted separately from or in conjunction with a granting of a "Class A" intoxicating liquor license. The number of Class "A" fermented malt beverage licenses the city may issue is subject only to the applicable limit under state law, if any.

#### Sec. 6-36. Standards for issuance; license quota for class B licenses.

#### (a) -Location of premises.

(1) -No retail Class A or B license shall be issued for premises the main entrance of which is less than three hundred (300) feet from the main entrance of any established public school, parochial school, hospital or church, except that this prohibition may be waived by a majority vote of the Common Council. Such distance shall be measured by the shortest route along the highway roadway from the closest point of the main entrance of such school, church or hospital to the main entrance of such premises.

(2) –This subsection shall not apply to premises licensed as such on June 30, 1947, nor shall it apply to any premises licensed as such prior to the occupation of real property within three hundred (300) feet thereof by any school, hospital or church building.

(3) –This subsection shall not apply to a restaurant located within three hundred (300) feet of a church or school. This paragraph applies only to restaurants in which the sale of alcohol beverages accounts for less than fifty (50%) percent of their gross receipts.

(b) **—Issuance to violators of liquor, beer or wine laws or ordinances.** No retail class A, B or C license shall be issued to any person who has been convicted of a violation of any federal or state liquor or fermented malt beverage law or wine law or the provisions of this division, section 6-1 or section 6-2 during one year prior to such application. A conviction of a member of a partnership or the partnership itself shall make the partnership or any member thereof ineligible for such license for one year.

(c) **Health, safety and sanitation requirements.** No retail Class A, B or C license shall be issued for any premises which do not conform to the sanitary, safety and health requirements of the state department of industry, labor and human relations pertaining to buildings and plumbing, to the rules and regulations of the State Department of Health and Family Services applicable to restaurants, and all such ordinances and regulations adopted by the city.

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(d) -License quota.

#### (1) -Class "B" fermented malt beverages license.

a. –The number of persons and places that may be granted a Class "B" $\stackrel{*}{}$ fermented malt beverage license under this division is limited to one (1) for each four hundred (400) population in the city, as defined by Wis. Stats. § 125.51(4).

b. –The City Council may grant a Class "B" fermented malt beverage license, as defined in Wis. Stats. Ch. 125, to any restaurant that will agree in writing to the following conditions:

1. –Fermented malt beverages will only be served for consumption on the premises (no carryouts).

2. –Fermented malt beverages will not be served in the original containers.

3. –Fermented malt beverages will only be served in open containers.

4. -Fermented malt beverages will only be served with food.

The Council may at any time add conditions to this agreement as it deems necessary for the health, welfare or safety of the community. The council may waive any of these requirements.

(2) – "Class B" liquor license.- Only one (1) "Class B" liquor license shall be granted for each 500 population in the city as defined by Wis. Stats. § 125.51(4).

(3) -Exceptions. -Nothing contained in this subsection shall prevent a license being granted to any person or the assignee of any person holding a "Class B" liquor license on May 10, 1977; nor shall anything contained in this subsection prevent the council, in its discretion, from granting a license to any person who otherwise qualifies therefor according to Wis. Stats. § 125.51(4)(g), or from granting a Class "B" fermented malt beverage license to a bona fide club, as defined in Wis. Stats. § 125.02(4), which has existed in the city for not less than six (6) years and has been incorporated in the state for not less than 30 years, if sale or service of fermented malt beverages is restricted to club members, members of affiliated clubs and guests of either in a separate room which is locked during closing hours and no carryout sales are made.

(4) –**"Class C" wine license**, –The City Council may grant a "Class C" wine license, as defined in Wis. Stats. § 125.51(3m), without quota, to any restaurant that will agree in writing to the following conditions:

a. –Sale of wine shall only be by the glass or in an open original container for consumption on the premises where sold.

b. –The person shall be qualified under Wis. Stats. § 125.04(5) for a restaurant in which the sale of alcohol beverages accounts for less than fifty (50%) percent of gross receipts and which does not have a barroom if

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the city's quota under subsection (d)(2) of this section and Wis. Stats. § 125.51(4) prohibits the city from issuing a "Class B" liquor license to that person.

c. –The license may not be issued to a foreign corporation, a foreign limited liability company or a person acting as an agent for or in the employ of another.

d. -The license shall particularly describe the premises for which it is issued.

The council may not waive at any time any of these requirements as they are by state statute, and the requirements may be amended by state statute from time to time.

(e) **-Payment of delinquent taxes, assessments and claims,** -No license shall be initially granted or renewed to any person or applicant who, or premises for which, municipal taxes, assessments, or overdue ordinance violation forfeitures due the City are delinquent and unpaid. When this section applies to an initial application for a license, the person or applicant shall be given notice of the intent to not issue the license and an opportunity to rebut the assertion of unpaid obligations. If this section is invoked upon a person or applicant request for renewal, the notice and opportunity for hearing provisions of Section 125.12(3) of the Wisconsin Statutes shall apply.

(f) **–Residences not to be licensed**. –No license shall be issued for the purpose of possessing, selling or offering for sale any intoxicating liquor or fermented malt beverage in any dwelling house, flat or residential apartment.

Stat. § 346.63, local ordinances in conformity therewith, or other similar laws from other states, (commonly referred to as OWI, OWPBAC, PBAC, DWI, or DUI); or driving any vehicle while under the influence of alcohol or drugs; or injuring any person or damaging any property while driving under the influence or alcohol or other drugs.

i. The City has generally found OWI convictions within one (1) year of application for a License are grounds for denial of a License.

ii. The City has also generally found two or more OWI convictions within five (5) years of application for a license can be grounds for denial of a License.

(2) Underage Drinking: Any underage drinking conviction which is the same as orsimilar to Wis. Stat. § 125.07(3) or (4) is substantially related to the duties and responsibilities associated with alcohol beverage licenses.

i. Any such underage drinking conviction within one (1) year of application for a license is typically grounds for denial.

ii. Two or more such underage drinking convictions within five (5) year of application for a license are typically grounds for denial.

(3) Service to Underage Persons. Any service to underage persons conviction which is the same as or similar to Wis. Stat. § 125.07(1)(a) is substantially related to the duties and responsibilities associated with alcohol beverage licenses.

i. Two (2) or more service to underage persons within one (1) year of  $\leftarrow$  application for a License is typically grounds for denial.

(4) Drug Offense. The City has generally found that the following convictions are substantially related to the duties and responsibilities associated with alcohol beverage licenses: manufacturing, distributing or delivering a controlled substance or controlled

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substance analog under Wis. Stat. § 961.41(1); possessing with intent to manufacture, distribute or deliver, a controlled substance or controlled substance analog under Wis. Stat. § 961.41(1m); possessing, with intent to manufacture, distribute or deliver, or manufacturing, distributing or delivering a controlled substance or controlled substance analog under a federal law or law of another state that is substantially similar to Wis. Stat. § 961.41(1) or (Im); possessing any of the materials listed in Wis. Stat. § 961.65 with intent to manufacture methamphetamine under that section or under federal law or a law of another state that is substantially similar to Wis. Stat. § 961.65; or possessing controlled substances as regulated by Chapter 961, Wis. Stats.

i. The City has generally found such convictions within one (1) year of application for a License are grounds for denial.

ii. The City has generally found two or more such convictions within five(5) years of application for License can be grounds for denial of a License.

(5) Overall Conviction Record, Felons, or Other Offenses. No operator's licensemay be issued under this guideline to any person who has:

i. Been convicted of a felony that substantially relates to the circumstances of the licensed activity unless the person has been duly pardoned;

ii. Been deemed a habitual law offender;

iii. Convictions not specifically listed above may also be grounds for denial of a License, as reasonably determined in the sound discretion of the City; or

Intentionally or accidently omitted any violation it will be considered a false application, resulting in the delay and or possible denial of the application.

In accordance with Section 130-171 to 130-176, Evansville Municipal Code, Section 62.23(7)(d)2 of the Wisconsin State Statutes and upon recommendation of the Plan Commission and the findings of the Common Council that such zoning district change is in the best interest of the City, and all necessary notices having been given, and the required public hearing having been held, and the Plan Commission having made its recommendation of approval in writing to the Common Council, the zoning classification of parcel 6-27-683 with Tax ID 222059076, at 339 E Franklin is changed from Agricultural District (A) to Residential District Two (R-2). The area to be rezoned is indicated on the maps below:



**SECTION 2.** <u>Zoning Map Amendment.</u> The official zoning map, City of Evansville, Wisconsin, is hereby amended to show the territory described in Section 1 as Residential District Two (R-2).

# **Background**

10 Responses to the RFP have been received, staff and park board chair have preliminarily reviewed the proposals and would like to proceed with selecting a final firm. The budget distributed during the referendum process included total projected cost of \$10.85 Million with Design Costs estimated at 10% or \$798,436.57 and Management Costs estimated at 8% or \$638,749.26. The RFP responses had a projected lump sum costs of design, construction drawings, and administration of range of \$477,808.00 to \$999,594.00. (Not all responses included construction administration).

#### A. Project Narrative

The City is seeking to engage a qualified firm to lead the project from design through construction of aquatic and park facilities in the City by engaging the public on schematic designs, outlining a project timeline, and fulfilling budget parameters. The project includes replacement of an aquatic center in historic Leonard-Leota Park with a splash pad and refurbished parking and grounds, and therefore demolish the existing facility. Additionally, the project will include the development of the 24-acre West Side Park to include a new outdoor aquatic center (with pool), athletic fields, parking/access drives, washrooms, concession stand, pavilion(s), a central pedestrian way, interconnecting trails, and other park amenities. Funding will be a combination of taxpayer funds as a result of recently approved referendum of \$9.4 million plus private donations of \$1.5 million. The project will be designed and constructed within a 24-month period with a goal of keeping existing facilities at both locations operational as much as possible. All changes will be made within the bounds of West Side and Leonard-Leota Parks.

The City has recently completed a 2020 update to its Park and Outdoor Recreation Plan and previously engaged consulting firms to provide concept designs for West Side Park and a new aquatic center at Leonard-Leota Park. These concepts were used as part of public outreach for the 2020 referendum. However, the desire to include the aquatic center at West Side Park will require revisiting these concepts. Additionally, the concept plans for West Side Park should be revised to include a strong pedestrian way to navigate park amenities.

#### **B.** Requested Services

The City is soliciting proposals and quotes for design, engineering and project management services to lead the City on the design, public outreach, bid management and procurement, construction administration and inspections related to the creation of a new aquatic center,

park, and splashpad. Initial work should focus on refining existing schematic designs for park and pool improvements to improve the organization of park elements.

### C. Project Budget

The firm selected by the City for this project will work with the city to develop a project to fit within the projected project budget as a result of a recent referendum for \$9.4 Million, plus private donations of \$1.5 Million. #### ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

#### Sec. 14-1. Definitions.

- **1.** Animal: means any multicellular organism under the scientific kingdom classification of Animalia.
- **2.** Animal control officer: means any person appointed by the City to act as animal control officer of the City or any police officer.
- 3. Commercial Animal Establishment: means an establishment that:
  - a. Bathes, clips, plucks, or otherwise grooms animals, not their own;
  - b. Breeds, boards, or buys;
  - c. Sells or donates more than 10 animals per calendar year;
  - d. Trains, or sports animals; or
  - e. Displays or exhibits animal
- 4. Cat: a small domesticated carnivore, Felis domestica or F. catus, bred in a number of varieties.
- 5. Dog: a domesticated canid, Canis familiaris, bred in many varieties.
- 6. Domestic Pet. means an animal that has been traditionally tamed and kept by humans as a service animal, or pet such as birds (i.e. caged birds such as parakeets, finches, macaws, and typically caged birds); small caged animals like hamsters, ferrets, sugar gliders, chinchillas, pet rats and gerbils: fish, but does not include including Dogs or Cats.
- 7. Exotic Animal. Means any animal which is kept within the city limits by a person, and does not meet the definition provided under Domestic Pet and is not a dog or cat.
- 8. Feral: existing in a natural state, not domesticated, or having reverted to the wild state, as from domestication; or characteristic of wild animals; ferocious; brutal.
- 9. Owner: means any person owning, keeping, harboring, temporarily taking care of, or having under their control one or more Pet.
- **10. Pet:** means all animals which are kept or cared for within the city limits by a person and including Exotic Animals, Domestic Pets, Dogs or Cats.
- **11. Pet Boarding Facility:** means the cages maintained by the Evansville Police Department, the Rock County Humane Society, or any private entity that conducts business as a kennel and contracts with the Evansville Police Department for boarding Pets.
- **12. Running at Large:** means that an animal is off the owner's premises, or on a public right of way on the owner's premises, and is not under the control of the owner or some other person.
- **13. Service Animal:** <u>means an animal specially trained to lead blind, deaf person or to</u> <u>provide support for mobility-impaired persons.</u> Any pet or animal under an owner's care that is to provide support to the owner due to blindness, deafness, lack of mobility or other diagnosable mental and physical conditions.

- **14.** Unkempt: means that the animal appears to be neglected, or is in poor health due to lack of food, dehydration, or untreated injuries.
- 15. Vicious: means that the Pet has been declared vicious pursuant to section 14-7.

#### Sec. 14-2. Excessive Animal Hoarding, Sheltering and Ownership.

- 1. No property owner shall make or allow such use of property or harbor animals in a manner that creates one of the following violations:
  - a. Neglect of the Animals The number of animals located at the property causing violations of 14-50 and/or 14-52 can be enforced under this provision.
  - b. Unsanitary Conditions for Humans –The location and/or number of animals cause or reasonably may cause health consequences to an individual or community such as, but not limited to, infectious bites or scratches to neighborhood children, Toxoplasmosis, asthma triggering caused by excessive urine, Leptospirosis, hookworms, Psittacosis, Lymphocytic Choriomeningitis Virus, Brucellosis, Scabies, Cryptosporidiosis, tape worms, insect infestation and rabies.
  - c. Unsanitary Conditions for Animals The number of animals in relation to the space available and/or care provided could cause the spread of distemper, ring worm, flea anemia, Toxoplasmosis, asthma triggering caused by excessive urine, Leptospirosis, hookworms, Psittacosis, Lymphocytic Choriomeningitis Virus, Brucellosis, Scabies, Cryptosporidiosis, tape worms, insect infestation, rabies and other unsanitary conditions.
  - d. Harboring or Attracting Feral and Stray Animals –The property owner's actions or allowance of such actions on their property creates a harbor for feral and/or stray animals by the creation of feeding stations, leaving the premises open for animals to freely leave and return or not properly containing their refuse.
  - e. Shelters –Evansville ordinances allow animal shelters to be permitted under proper licensing and zoning requirements. Shelters that are temporary, non-profit and commercial must be properly licensed, zoned, and maintained so that they do not violate any other section of the municipal code. This sub-section excludes family/friends or volunteers of non-profit shelters watching an animal temporarily unless a separate violation of this Chapter occurs. If a separate violation occurs then this section may be enforced without exception.
  - f. Noise Disturbance Violation of ordinance 14-8 and/or 82.161
  - g. Property Maintenance and Nuisance Violations of any ordinances pertaining to the maintenance and care of properties caused by the number of animals or causes the attraction of animals that may result a public nuisance.
- 2. Any property owner creating or allowing such a violation shall be responsible for the humane disposal or placement of the animals to the extent the property is no longer in violation of local ordinances.

#### Sec. 14-3. Running at large.

1. No person having in his possession or under his control any animal shall allow the animal to run at large within the city.

- 2. *Impoundment authorized.* The police department or any other officer appointed by the City shall attempt to apprehend any animal running at large within the city or any dog or cat which does any of the things prohibited under section 14-31(3). The animal may be held at the police department or other location approved by the police department for a period of 1 day or such additional time as the chief of police may determine. If the police department is unable to identify the owner of the animal; or the owner of the animal fails to respond to the police department; or pay the fees and charges the animal may be transferred to a veterinary clinic or animal boarding facility for the duration of the holding period at the expense of the owner.
- 3. *Fees and charges.* The owner shall be responsible for the expense of all fees and charges for apprehension, impoundment, transport, veterinary care, quarantine, observation, and examination of the animal and may be subject to a forfeiture as provided in section 1-11. Fees and charges shall be as established by the council from time to time by resolution.
- 4. *Release to owner*. An animal may be returned to its owner upon proof that the owner has either resolved, or enrolled the animal in training to resolve, the reason the animal was impounded, completion of any required quarantine period, and payment of the fees and charges. If after seven (7) days from the date the animal was impounded or five (5) days after the expiration of the quarantined period, whichever is longer, the owner does not claim the animal and pay the fees and charges, ownership of the animal will be relinquished. The chief of police, instead of having the animal destroyed, may authorize the Rock County Humane Society or another non-profit organization to place the animal for adoption.

#### Sec. 14-4. Animals not permitted on school grounds.

No owner shall permit their Pet to be upon any school property except upon express permission of the school principal or their designee, except when a dog is participating in an organized event or activity. This does not include animals that would otherwise be considered Service Animals.

## Sec. 14-5. Unattended animals in standing or parked vehicles – Authority to remove – Liability for Removal.

No person may leave a Pet unattended in a standing or parked vehicle in a manner that endanger the health or safety of such animal. If a Pet is found in a standing or parked vehicle, and the health and safety of the animal appears to be endangered, any animal control officer or police officer may use reasonable force to remove such animal. Removal of an unattended animal by an animal control officer or police officer shall not constitute an offense. Prior to the use of reasonable force the animal control officer or police officer shall attempt to contact the owner or operator of the vehicle.

#### Sec. 14-6. Confinement and observation of Pets biting person.

1. Any Pet known to have bitten any person shall be immediately seized by a police officer of the city and reported at once to the county health department for observation and attention. Such Pet shall be placed in an isolation facility for observation for ten days or such additional period as the officer may require under Wis. Stats. § 95.21, at the expense of the owner.

- 2. If the Pet has not been seized, the owner shall, on demand of the person bitten, a police officer or the county health department, immediately deliver such Pet to an isolation facility to be held for ten days for observation at the expense of the owner.
- 3. The individual or entity that takes responsibility for completing the quarantine of a Pet shall report at the end of such observation without delay to the county health department by telephone and confirmed in writing all reports required by law under Wis. Ch 95 regarding the quarantine.
- 4. Any person who refuses or fails to deliver such Pet as required shall be subject to a forfeiture as provided in section 1-11.
- 5. If after five days or such additional time as the chief of police in his discretion may deem advisable following such ten-day observation period, the owner does not claim such animal and pay the cost of keeping such animal, such officer shall dispose of the animal in a proper and humane manner. The chief of police, instead of destroying such animal, may authorize the Rock County Humane Society or another non-profit organization to place the Pet for adoption.
- 6. If the Pet is a dog or cat and the person has proof of current rabies vaccination, the isolation may be conducted within the owner's home in compliance with Wisconsin statutes.

#### Sec. 14-7. Declaration of vicious animal.

The owner of a vicious animal must remove the animal from City limits or have the animal humanely disposed. An animal may be declared to be a vicious animal by at least two persons employed as a police officer, animal control officer, veterinarian, or the attending physician of a victim of an animal bite or scratch. In making such a declaration the individuals shall consider an animal to be vicious if:

- 1. An animal which, in a vicious or aggressive manner, approaches in an apparent attitude of attack, or bites, inflicts injury, assaults or otherwise attacks a person or other animal upon the streets, sidewalks or any public grounds, parks or places; or
- 2. An animal, while on private property, approaches in an apparent attitude of attack, or bites, inflicts injury, assaults or otherwise attacks a postal worker, meter reader, service person, journeyman, delivery person, or another person or animal that are on the private property with the consent of the owner or occupant of the private property.
- 3. No animal may be declared vicious if the injury or damage is sustained to any person or animal who is committing a willful trespass or is not authorized to be upon the premises occupied by the owner of the animal, or who is teasing, tormenting, abusing or assaulting the animal or was committing or attempting to commit a crime.
- 4. The following factors may also be considered in making a determination of viciousness.
  - a. The nature or severity of the attack or bite.
  - b. Whether the animal has shown a propensity to display dangerously aggressive behavior and is able or likely to inflict injury to another animal or person.
  - c. Previous incidents of a similar nature.

#### Sec. 14-8. Disturbing the peace prohibited.

No person may keep a Pet which disturbs the peace by loud or unusual noises at any time of the day or night. habitually makes noise to the annoyance of any two or more other person.

#### Sec. 14-9. Animals as prizes.

No Person or entity shall offer as a prize or give away any animal, except a small fish in a plastic bag with enough water for the fish to easily move around, in a contest, raffle or lottery, as an enticement to enter any place of business, or to exploit any animal for the purpose of fundraising.

#### Sec. 14-10. Carcasses

Carcasses of Pets shall be buried or otherwise disposed of in a sanitary manner within 24 hours after death.

#### ARTICLE II. DOGS AND CATS

#### Sec. 14-31. License.

- 1. *Required.* Every person residing in the city who owns a dog or cat which is more than five months of age on January 1 of any year or five months of age within the license year shall, on or before the date the dog or cat becomes five months of age, and annually thereafter, pay the dog or cat license fee and obtain a license therefore.
- 2. *Fees.* Such owner shall pay to the city clerk/treasurer the amount as established by the council from time to time by resolution. The owner of any dog or cat who fails to obtain a license prior to April 1 of each year or within 30 days of acquiring ownership of a licensable dog or cat, or fails to obtain a license on or before the dog or cat reaches licensable age shall pay an additional late fee as established by the council from time to time by resolution and be subject to further penalties pursuant to section 14-62.
- 3. *Issuance; tag.* Upon payment to the city clerk-treasurer of the required fee, the clerk-treasurer shall issue to such person a license and tag bearing a serial number in the form prescribed by Wis. Stats. § 174.07, to keep such dog or cat for the license year. The owner shall upon procuring the license place upon the dog or cat a collar and shall securely attach and keep attached the tag furnished to him by the city clerk-treasurer to the collar as required by Wis. Stats. § 174.07. If the owner desires or the animal cannot wear a collar and tag, a micro chip may be implanted so long as the information is place on file with the City. No license shall be issued under this article for any dog or cat unless the applicant exhibits a certificate of a qualified veterinarian showing that the dog or cat is currently immunized against rabies and distemper. The owner shall attach the rabies vaccination tag to a collar, which shall be kept on the dog or cat at all times, but this requirement does not apply to a dog or cat during competition or training, to a dog while hunting, to a dog while actively involved in herding or controlling livestock if the dog is under the control of its owner, as required by Wis. Stats. § 95.21(2)(f).
- 4. Every Pet specially trained to lead blind or deaf persons, designated as a service animal to the owner by a licensed medical health professional, or to provide support for mobility-impaired persons is exempt from the license fee.

#### Sec. 14-32. Applicability of state law.

The provisions of Wis. Stats. ch. 174 and Wis. Stats. § 95.21, except for imprisonment penalties imposed are hereby adopted and by reference made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth herein. Any act required to be performed or prohibited by any statute incorporated in this section by reference is required or prohibited under this Code. Any future amendments, revisions or modifications of the statutes incorporated in this section are intended to be made part of this Code.

#### Sec. 14-33. Harboring certain dogs or cats prohibited.

No person shall possess, harbor or keep any animal which:

- 1. Habitually pursues any vehicles upon any public street, alley or highway.
- 2. Which has been declared vicious.
- 3. Habitually makes noise to the annoyance of any two or more other persons.
- 4.3. Is required to be licensed, but is not.
- 5.4. Does not have a valid license tag and current rabies vaccination tag attached to a collar which is kept on the dog or cat whenever the dog or cat is outdoors and not securely confined in a fenced area.

#### Sec. 14-35. Removal of waste deposited on public or private property.

(a) *Removal required.* Any person owning or having control of any <u>dog animal</u> on property, public or private, which property is not owned or occupied by such person, shall promptly remove excrement left by such <u>dog animal</u> and place it in a proper receptacle, bury it or flush it in a toilet on property owned or occupied by the person.

(b) *Possession of means of removal required.* Any person causing or permitting an animal dog to be on any property, public or private, which property is not owned or occupied by such person, shall have in his immediate possession a device or object suitable for removal of the excrement and a depository for the transmission of the excrement to property owned or occupied by the person.

(c) *Penalty*. Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of this section shall be issued a warning for the first offense and, upon conviction thereafter, shall be subject to punishment as provided in section 1-11.

#### **ARTICLE III. EXOTIC ANIMALS**

#### Sec. 14-40. Licensing requirements.

Any person who resides within the City limits and is the owner of an Exotic Animal which is within the City limits, shall license the Exotic Animal with the city clerk. Every person residing in the city who owns an Exotic Animal on January 1 of any year or within 30 days of acquiring ownership shall annually and thereafter obtain a license.

Such owner shall pay to the city clerk/treasurer the amount as established by the council from time to time by resolution. The owner of any Exotic Animal who fails to obtain a license prior to April 1 of each year or within 30 days of acquiring ownership of an Exotic Animal shall pay an additional late fee as established by the council from time to time by resolution and be subject to further penalties pursuant to section 14-62.

#### Sec. 14-41. Providing registration information to relevant personnel.

The city clerk shall provide copies of all Exotic Animal registrations to the police department and other emergency rescue personnel which may have reason to enter the premises where wild animals are present for purposes of rescue operations resulting from a natural disaster or personal emergency.

#### Sec. 14-42. Prohibited animals

It shall be unlawful for any person to keep maintain or have in their possession or under their control within the City any poisonous reptile or other dangerous animal, hybrid animal, carnivorous wild animal or reptile, vicious or dangerous domesticated animal or any other animal or reptile of wild, vicious, or dangerous propensities. Short term educational exhibits are exempt from this provision.

#### Sec. 14-43. Prohibited animals enumerated.

- 1. In addition to the prohibition in section 14 42, it shall be unlawful for any person to keep, maintain or have in their possession or under their control within the City any of the following animals:
  - a. Any animal which has been declared to be protected or endangered by the U.S. Department of Interior;
  - b. All poisonous animals, including snakes; that upon touch or bite may cause hallucinations, alter cardiopulmonary functions, or even death.
  - c. Badgers;
  - d. Bears
  - e. Beavers
  - f. Canids (such as: wolves, foxes, coyotes, jackals, dingoes, or raccoon dogs);
  - g. Civet;
  - h. Constrictor snakes above six (6) feet in length
  - i. Crocodilian (such as: Alligators, crocodiles, or caimans);
  - j. Falconiformes (such as: eagles, hawks, owls, or falcons) except falcons and hawks in the possession of a state or federally licensed handler;
  - k. Edentata (such as: anteaters, tamaduas, sloths, or armadillos);
  - 1. Emus
  - m. Felids (such as: lions, tigers, leopards, cheetahs, jaguars, pumas, lynx, ocelots, or bobcats);

- n. Game cocks and other fighting birds;
- o. Hyenas
- p. Marsupials (such as: opossums, Tasmanian wolf, kangaroos, koalas, or wombats);
- q. Muskrats
- r. Ostriches
- s. Porcupine
- t. Primates (such as: apes, monkeys, baboons, chimpanzees, gibbons, gorillas, orangutans, siamangs.)
- u. Procyonids (such as: raccoons, coatis, kinkajous, ring-tailed cats, or pandas)
- v. Rheas;
- w. Skunks;
- x. Squirrels;
- y. Sharks;
- z. Ungulates (such as: elephants, zebra, tapirs, rhinoceroses, camel, llama, caribou, antelope, bison, reindeer, deer, giraffe, hippopotamus, wild boar, gazelle, or gnu);
- aa. Water buffalo;
- bb. Wart hogs;
- cc. Weasels;
- dd. Wolverines;
- ee. Woodchucks; or
- ff. Any other dangerous animal.

#### Sec. 14-44. Owner to report escape of Exotic Animal.

The owner or keeper of any Exotic Animal that escapes from their custody or control shall within one hour after they discover or reasonably should have discovered the escape, report it to a law enforcement officer of the City and the County Sheriff where the escape occurred.

#### ARTICLE IV. CRUELTY TO ANIMALS AND RELATED OFFENSES

#### Sec. 14-50. Cruelty to animals generally.

No Person shall beat, torture, or injure any animal, nor overload any working animal, nor shall any person abuse, mistreat or neglect any such animal.

#### Sec. 14.51. Reserved

#### Sec. 14-52. Humane care of animals.

All persons keeping, possessing and/or in control of an animal shall provide the animal with sufficient food and water, proper shelter, humane care and treatment and veterinary care when needed to prevent suffering. No person shall mistreat any animal nor shall any animal be abandoned. An owner may take an animal they no longer desire to care for to an Animal Shelter licensed by the State of Wisconsin.

#### Sec. 14-53. Poisoning of Pets.

It shall be unlawful for any person to administer or cause to be administered a substance which they knew or should have known was a poison of any sort whatsoever to any Pet, or to place any poison or poisoned food where the same is accessible to any Pet.

#### Sec. 14-54. Instigating or allowing fights between animals.

No person shall engage in or allow any fighting between animals of any kind upon their premises or premises in their possession or under their control in the City. No person shall keep any house, pit, or other place to be used in permitting fights between animals. No person shall instigate or encourage any animal to attack, bite, wound, or worry another animal for any bet, stake, reward or entertainment.

#### Sec. 14-55. Injured or ill animals.

Whenever an animal control officer encounters a stray animal suffering pain, the animal control officer may take the animal to a veterinarian where the cost of any care or treatment shall be borne by the owner of the animal. If ownership of the animal cannot be determined, the animal control officer shall impound the animal for five days unless it appears that a longer impoundment will lead to identification of the owner. If the owner cannot be located the animal may be disposed of by humane means without notice.

#### ARTICLE V. COMMERCIAL ANIMAL ESTABLISHMENTS.

#### Sec. 14-60. Permit Required.

No Person or entity shall operate a commercial animal establishment without first obtaining a permit. An application for a commercial animal establishment permit shall be made to the city clerk, and the applicant shall pay a fee prior to the city clerk issuing a commercial animal establishment permit. No permit shall be granted without an inspection of the premises to determine compliance with this Code and state law. The permit shall be issued for one year, commencing on January 1 of each year. Renewal applications for permits shall be made 30 days prior to and up to 30 days after the start of the calendar year. If there is a change of ownership of a commercial animal establishment, the new owner shall obtain a permit.

#### Sec. 14-61. Operation of Commercial Animal Establishments.

Every Commercial Animal Establishment:

- 1. Shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition and not to allow any refuse or waste material to accumulate.
- 2. Shall have impervious, smooth and cleanable floors.
- 3. Shall post its permit in a conspicuous place open to the public.
- 4. Shall isolate and treat any animal in its possession which has any disease, injure, or abnormality and may not sell such animal without full disclosure to the buyer of the condition of the animal.

- 5. Shall furnish the buyer of any animal, except fish, with a written statement of sale showing the date of sale, approximate age of the animal, immunization and medication type and date administered, and the names of both the seller and buyer.
- 6. Shall take measures to limit the potential creation of a noise nuisance and take measures to mitigate the actual noise at the establishment or premise.
- A violation of this chapter shall be cause for revocation of the Commercial Animal Establishment Permit. (Ord. 2020-05)

- In #13 remove "Any per or animal under an owner's care that is to provide support to the owner due to blindness, deafness, lack of mobility or either other diagnosable mental and physical conditions." For licensing purposes a service animal is defined as specially trained to lead blind, or deaf person or provide support for mobility-impaired persons.

**Reason:** This removes the confusion with Dogs as Domestic Pets and Service Animals.

#### II. Change of 14-2.1.f:

#### Sec. 14-2. Excessive Animal Hoarding, Sheltering and Ownership.

- 1. No property owner shall make or allow such use of property or harbor animals in a manner that creates one of the following violations:
  - a. Neglect of the Animals The number of animals located at the property causing violations of 14-50 and/or 14-52 can be enforced under this provision.
  - b. Unsanitary Conditions for Humans –The location and/or number of animals cause or reasonably may cause health consequences to an individual or community such as, but not limited to, infectious bites or scratches to neighborhood children, Toxoplasmosis, asthma triggering caused by excessive urine, Leptospirosis, hookworms, Psittacosis, Lymphocytic Choriomeningitis Virus, Brucellosis, Scabies, Cryptosporidiosis, tape worms, insect infestation and rabies.

- c. Unsanitary Conditions for Animals The number of animals in relation to the space available and/or care provided could cause the spread of distemper, ringworm, flea anemia, Toxoplasmosis, asthma triggering caused by excessive urine, Leptospirosis, hookworms, Psittacosis, Lymphocytic Choriomeningitis Virus, Brucellosis, Scabies, Cryptosporidiosis, tape worms, insect infestation, rabies and other unsanitary conditions.
- d. Harboring or Attracting Feral and Stray Animals –The property owner's actions or allowance of such actions on their property creates a harbor for feral and/or stray animals by the creation of feeding stations, leaving the premises open for animals to freely leave and return or not properly containing their refuse.
- e. Shelters –Evansville ordinances allow animal shelters to be permitted under proper licensing and zoning requirements. Shelters that are temporary, non-profit and commercial must be properly licensed, zoned, and maintained so that they do not violate any other section of the municipal code. This sub-section excludes family/friends or volunteers of non-profit shelters watching an animal temporarily unless a separate violation of this Chapter occurs. If a separate violation occurs then this section may be enforced without exception.
- f. Noise Disturbance Violation of ordinance 14-8 and/or 82.161
- g. Property Maintenance and Nuisance Violations of any ordinances pertaining to the maintenance and care of properties caused by the number of animals or causes the attraction of animals that may result a public nuisance.
- 2. Any property owner creating or allowing such a violation shall be responsible for the humane disposal or placement of the animals to the extent the property is no longer in violation of local ordinances.

(Ord. 2020-05)

Strikeout "and/or 82.161".

#### Reason:

82.161 refers to "person(s)" and not applicable in this chapter.

### III. Change of 14-8:

- **14-8:** No person may keep a Pet which disturbs the peace by loud or unusual noises at any time of the day or night
- Strikeout "disturbs the peace by loud or unusual noises at any time of the day or night." and replace with "habitually makes noise to the annoyance of any two or more other persons." Ordinance should read, "No person may keep a Pet which habitually makes noise to the annoyance of any two or more other persons."

#### Reason:

This change makes consistency for all animals referred to in the definition of "Pet".

#### Aticle II Dogs & Cats:

#### Sec 14.31- Sec. 14-31. License.

1.Required. Every person residing in the city who owns a dog or cat which is more than five months of age on January 1 of any year or five months of age within the license year shall, on or before the date the dog or cat becomes five months of age, and annually thereafter, pay the dog or cat license fee and obtain a license therefore.

2.Fees. Such owner shall pay to the city clerk/treasurer the amount as established by the council from time to time by resolution. The owner of any dog or cat who fails to obtain a license prior to April 1 of each year or within 30 days of acquiring ownership of a licensable dog or cat, or fails to obtain a license on or before the dog or cat reaches licensable age shall pay an additional late fee as established by the council from time to time by resolution and be subject to further penalties pursuant to section 14-62.

3.Issuance; tag. Upon payment to the city clerk-treasurer of the required fee, the clerk-treasurer shall issue to such person a license and tag bearing a serial number in the form prescribed by Wis. Stats. § 174.07, to keep such dog or cat for the license year. The owner shall upon procuring the license place upon the dog or cat a collar and shall securely attach and keep attached the tag furnished to him by the city clerk-treasurer to the collar as required by Wis. Stats. § 174.07. If the owner desires or the animal cannot wear a collar and tag, a micro-chip may be implanted so long as the information is place on file with the City. No license shall be issued under this article for any dog or cat unless the applicant exhibits a certificate of a qualified veterinarian showing that the dog or cat is currently immunized against rabies and distemper. The owner shall attach the rabies vaccination tag to a collar, which shall be kept on the dog or cat at all times, but this requirement does not apply to a dog or cat during competition or training, to a dog while hunting, to a dog or cat securely confined indoors, to a dog or cat securely confined in a fenced area or to a dog while actively involved in herding or controlling livestock if the dog is under the control of its owner, as required by Wis. Stats. § 95.21(2)(f).

4.Every Pet specially trained to lead blind or deaf persons, designated as a service animal to the owner by a licensed medical health professional, or to provide support for mobility-impaired persons is exempt from the license fee.

# 3 Strikeout "If the owner desires or the animal cannot wear a collar and tag, a micro-chip may be implanted so long as the information is place on file with the City." & Strikeout "Distemper

#### Reason:

The City does not have a system to track/search microchip numbers. WI SS does not require distemper only rabies. We've come across some dogs that are allergic to distemper shots.

#4 Strikeout "designated as a service animal to the owner by a licensed medical health professional,"

#### Reason:

Per WI State statute 174.055 the only exemptions are dogs for blind, deaf & mobility impaired

#### VI. Change of 14-33:

#### 14-33. Harboring certain dogs or cats prohibited.

No person shall possess, harbor or keep any animal which:

- 1. Habitually pursues any vehicles upon any public street, alley or highway.
- 2. Which has been declared vicious.
- 3. Habitually makes noise to the annoyance of any two or more other persons.
- 4. Is required to be licensed, but is not.
- 5. Does not have a valid license tag and current rabies vaccination tag attached to a collar which is kept on the dog or cat whenever the dog or cat is outdoors and not securely confined in a fenced area.
- Strikeout 14-33.3, "Habitually makes noise to the annoyance of any two or more other persons."

#### Reason:

With the proposed changes, this is now addressed in 14-8 and applies to all pets and unnecessary for 14-33 which refers to just cats and dogs.

#### Sec. 14-35. Removal of waste deposited on public or private property.

(a) *Removal required.* Any person owning or having control of any animal on property, public or private, which property is not owned or occupied by such person, shall promptly remove excrement left by such dog and place it in a proper receptacle, bury it or flush it in a toilet on property owned or occupied by the person.

(b) *Possession of means of removal required*. Any person causing or permitting an animal to be on any property, public or private, which property is not owned or occupied by such person, shall have in his immediate possession a device or object suitable for removal of the excrement and a depository for the transmission of the excrement to property owned or occupied by the person.

(c) *Penalty*. Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of this section shall be issued a warning for the first offense and, upon conviction thereafter, shall be subject to punishment as provided in section 1-11.

#### Strikeout a & b, "a dog." And change it to any animal

#### **Reason:**

Don't want to limit to just dogs, you want to cover all animals.





#### Background


10 Responses to the RFP have been received, staff and park board chair have preliminarily reviewed the proposals and would like to proceed with selecting a final firm. The budget distributed during the referendum process included total projected cost of \$10.85 Million with Design Costs estimated at 10% or \$798,436.57 and Management Costs estimated at 8% or \$638,749.26. The RFP responses had a projected lump sum costs of design, construction drawings, and administration of range of \$477,808.00 to \$999,594.00. (Not all responses included construction administration).


#### Next Steps

#### A. Project Narrative

The City is seeking to engage a qualified firm to lead the project from design through construction of aquatic and park facilities in the City by engaging the public on schematic designs, outlining a project timeline, and fulfilling budget parameters. The project includes replacement of an aquatic center in historic Leonard-Leota Park with a splash pad and refurbished parking and grounds, and therefore demolish the existing facility. Additionally, the project will include the development of the 24-acre West Side Park to include a new outdoor aquatic center (with pool), athletic fields, parking/access drives, washrooms, concession stand, pavilion(s), a central pedestrian way, interconnecting trails, and other park amenities. Funding will be a combination of taxpayer funds as a result of recently approved referendum of \$9.4 million plus private donations of \$1.5 million. The project will be designed and constructed within a 24-month period with a goal of keeping existing facilities at both locations operational as much as possible. All changes will be made within the bounds of West Side and Leonard-Leota Parks.

The City has recently completed a 2020 update to its Park and Outdoor Recreation Plan and previously engaged consulting firms to provide concept designs for West Side Park and a new aquatic center at Leonard-Leota Park. These concepts were used as part of public outreach for the 2020 referendum. However, the desire to include the aquatic center at West Side Park will require revisiting these concepts. Additionally, the concept plans for West Side Park should be revised to include a strong pedestrian way to navigate park amenities.

#### **B.** Requested Services

The City is soliciting proposals and quotes for design, engineering and project management services to lead the City on the design, public outreach, bid management and procurement, construction administration and inspections related to the creation of a new aquatic center,

park, and splashpad. Initial work should focus on refining existing schematic designs for park and pool improvements to improve the organization of park elements.

#### C. Project Budget

The firm selected by the City for this project will work with the city to develop a project to fit within the projected project budget as a result of a recent referendum for \$9.4 Million, plus private donations of \$1.5 Million. The total \$10.9 Million budget is expected to include all project construction costs, contingencies, and fees.

#### **ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL**

#### Sec. 14-1. Definitions.

- 1. Animal: means any multicellular organism under the scientific kingdom classification of Animalia.
- 2. Animal control officer: means any person appointed by the City to act as animal control officer of the City or any police officer.
- 3. Commercial Animal Establishment: means an establishment that:
  - a. Bathes, clips, plucks, or otherwise grooms animals, not their own;
  - b. Breeds, boards, or buys;
  - c. Sells or donates more than 10 animals per calendar year;
  - d. Trains, or sports animals; or
  - e. Displays or exhibits animal
- 4. Cat: a small domesticated carnivore, Felis domestica or F. catus, bred in a number of varieties.
- 5. Dog: a domesticated canid, Canis familiaris, bred in many varieties.
- 6. Domestic Pet. means an animal that has been traditionally tamed and kept by humans as a service animal, or pet such as birds (i.e. caged birds such as parakeets, finches, macaws, and typically caged birds); small caged animals like hamsters, ferrets, sugar gliders, chinchillas, pet rats and gerbils: fish, but does not include including Dogs or Cats.
- 7. Exotic Animal. Means any animal which is kept within the city limits by a person, and does not meet the definition provided under Domestic Pet-and is not a dog or cat.
- 8. Feral: existing in a natural state, not domesticated, or having reverted to the wild state, as from domestication; or characteristic of wild animals; ferocious; brutal.
- **9. Owner:** means any person owning, keeping, harboring, temporarily taking care of, or having under their control one or more Pet.
- **10. Pet:** means all animals which are kept or cared for within the city limits by a person and including Exotic Animals, Domestic Pets, Dogs or Cats.
- **11. Pet Boarding Facility:** means the cages maintained by the Evansville Police Department, the Rock County Humane Society, or any private entity that conducts business as a kennel and contracts with the Evansville Police Department for boarding Pets.
- 12. Running at Large: means that an animal is off the owner's premises, or on a public right of way on the owner's premises, and is not under the control of the owner or some other person.
- Service Animal: means an animal specially trained to lead blind, deaf person or to provide support for mobility-impaired persons. Any pet or animal under an owner's care that is to provide support to the owner due to blindness, deafness, lack of mobility or other diagnosable mental and physical conditions.

- 14. Unkempt: means that the animal appears to be neglected, or is in poor health due to lack of food, dehydration, or untreated injuries.
- **15. Vicious:** means that the Pet has been declared vicious pursuant to section 14-7.

#### Sec. 14-2. Excessive Animal Hoarding, Sheltering and Ownership.

- 1. No property owner shall make or allow such use of property or harbor animals in a manner that creates one of the following violations:
  - a. Neglect of the Animals The number of animals located at the property causing violations of 14-50 and/or 14-52 can be enforced under this provision.
  - b. Unsanitary Conditions for Humans The location and/or number of animals cause or reasonably may cause health consequences to an individual or community such as, but not limited to, infectious bites or scratches to neighborhood children, Toxoplasmosis, asthma triggering caused by excessive urine, Leptospirosis, hookworms, Psittacosis, Lymphocytic Choriomeningitis Virus, Brucellosis, Scabies, Cryptosporidiosis, tape worms, insect infestation and rabies.
  - c. Unsanitary Conditions for Animals The number of animals in relation to the space available and/or care provided could cause the spread of distemper, ring worm, flea anemia, Toxoplasmosis, asthma triggering caused by excessive urine, Leptospirosis, hookworms, Psittacosis, Lymphocytic Choriomeningitis Virus, Brucellosis, Scabies, Cryptosporidiosis, tape worms, insect infestation, rabies and other unsanitary conditions.
  - d. Harboring or Attracting Feral and Stray Animals –The property owner's actions or allowance of such actions on their property creates a harbor for feral and/or stray animals by the creation of feeding stations, leaving the premises open for animals to freely leave and return or not properly containing their refuse.
  - e. Shelters –Evansville ordinances allow animal shelters to be permitted under proper licensing and zoning requirements. Shelters that are temporary, non-profit and commercial must be properly licensed, zoned, and maintained so that they do not violate any other section of the municipal code. This sub-section excludes family/friends or volunteers of non-profit shelters watching an animal temporarily unless a separate violation of this Chapter occurs. If a separate violation occurs then this section may be enforced without exception.
  - f. Noise Disturbance Violation of ordinance 14-8 and/or 82.161
  - g. Property Maintenance and Nuisance Violations of any ordinances pertaining to the maintenance and care of properties caused by the number of animals or causes the attraction of animals that may result a public nuisance.
- 2. Any property owner creating or allowing such a violation shall be responsible for the humane disposal or placement of the animals to the extent the property is no longer in violation of local ordinances.

1. No person having in his possession or under his control any animal shall allow the animal to run at large within the city.

- 2. *Impoundment authorized.* The police department or any other officer appointed by the City shall attempt to apprehend any animal running at large within the city or any dog or cat which does any of the things prohibited under section 14-31(3). The animal may be held at the police department or other location approved by the police department for a period of 1 day or such additional time as the chief of police may determine. If the police department is unable to identify the owner of the animal; or the owner of the animal fails to respond to the police department; or pay the fees and charges the animal may be transferred to a veterinary clinic or animal boarding facility for the duration of the holding period at the expense of the owner.
- 3. *Fees and charges.* The owner shall be responsible for the expense of all fees and charges for apprehension, impoundment, transport, veterinary care, quarantine, observation, and examination of the animal and may be subject to a forfeiture as provided in section 1-11. Fees and charges shall be as established by the council from time to time by resolution.
- 4. *Release to owner*. An animal may be returned to its owner upon proof that the owner has either resolved, or enrolled the animal in training to resolve, the reason the animal was impounded, completion of any required quarantine period, and payment of the fees and charges. If after seven (7) days from the date the animal was impounded or five (5) days after the expiration of the quarantined period, whichever is longer, the owner does not claim the animal and pay the fees and charges, ownership of the animal will be relinquished. The chief of police, instead of having the animal destroyed, may authorize the Rock County Humane Society or another non-profit organization to place the animal for adoption.

#### Sec. 14-4. Animals not permitted on school grounds.

No owner shall permit their Pet to be upon any school property except upon express permission of the school principal or their designee, except when a dog is participating in an organized event or activity. This does not include animals that would otherwise be considered Service Animals.

## Sec. 14-5. Unattended animals in standing or parked vehicles – Authority to remove – Liability for Removal.

No person may leave a Pet unattended in a standing or parked vehicle in a manner that endanger the health or safety of such animal. If a Pet is found in a standing or parked vehicle, and the health and safety of the animal appears to be endangered, any animal control officer or police officer may use reasonable force to remove such animal. Removal of an unattended animal by an animal control officer or police officer shall not constitute an offense. Prior to the use of reasonable force the animal control officer or police officer shall attempt to contact the owner or operator of the vehicle.

#### Sec. 14-6. Confinement and observation of Pets biting person.

1. Any Pet known to have bitten any person shall be immediately seized by a police officer of the city and reported at once to the county health department for observation and attention. Such Pet shall be placed in an isolation facility for observation for ten days or such additional period as the officer may require under Wis. Stats. § 95.21, at the expense of the owner.

- 2. If the Pet has not been seized, the owner shall, on demand of the person bitten, a police officer or the county health department, immediately deliver such Pet to an isolation facility to be held for ten days for observation at the expense of the owner.
- 3. The individual or entity that takes responsibility for completing the quarantine of a Pet shall report at the end of such observation without delay to the county health department by telephone and confirmed in writing all reports required by law under Wis. Ch 95 regarding the quarantine.
- 4. Any person who refuses or fails to deliver such Pet as required shall be subject to a forfeiture as provided in section 1-11.
- 5. If after five days or such additional time as the chief of police in his discretion may deem advisable following such ten-day observation period, the owner does not claim such animal and pay the cost of keeping such animal, such officer shall dispose of the animal in a proper and humane manner. The chief of police, instead of destroying such animal, may authorize the Rock County Humane Society or another non-profit organization to place the Pet for adoption.
- 6. If the Pet is a dog or cat and the person has proof of current rabies vaccination, the isolation may be conducted within the owner's home in compliance with Wisconsin statutes.

#### Sec. 14-7. Declaration of vicious animal.

The owner of a vicious animal must remove the animal from City limits or have the animal humanely disposed. An animal may be declared to be a vicious animal by at least two persons employed as a police officer, animal control officer, veterinarian, or the attending physician of a victim of an animal bite or scratch. In making such a declaration the individuals shall consider an animal to be vicious if:

- 1. An animal which, in a vicious or aggressive manner, approaches in an apparent attitude of attack, or bites, inflicts injury, assaults or otherwise attacks a person or other animal upon the streets, sidewalks or any public grounds, parks or places; or
- 2. An animal, while on private property, approaches in an apparent attitude of attack, or bites, inflicts injury, assaults or otherwise attacks a postal worker, meter reader, service person, journeyman, delivery person, or another person or animal that are on the private property with the consent of the owner or occupant of the private property.
- 3. No animal may be declared vicious if the injury or damage is sustained to any person or animal who is committing a willful trespass or is not authorized to be upon the premises occupied by the owner of the animal, or who is teasing, tormenting, abusing or assaulting the animal or was committing or attempting to commit a crime.
- 4. The following factors may also be considered in making a determination of viciousness.
  - a. The nature or severity of the attack or bite.
  - b. Whether the animal has shown a propensity to display dangerously aggressive behavior and is able or likely to inflict injury to another animal or person.
  - c. Previous incidents of a similar nature.

#### Sec. 14-8. Disturbing the peace prohibited.

No person may keep a Pet which disturbs the peace by loud or unusual noises at any time of the day or night. habitually makes noise to the annoyance of any two or more other person.

#### (Ord 2021-04)

#### Sec. 14-9. Animals as prizes.

No Person or entity shall offer as a prize or give away any animal, except a small fish in a plastic bag with enough water for the fish to easily move around, in a contest, raffle or lottery, as an enticement to enter any place of business, or to exploit any animal for the purpose of fundraising.

#### Sec. 14-10. Carcasses

Carcasses of Pets shall be buried or otherwise disposed of in a sanitary manner within 24 hours after death.

#### Secs. 14-11--14-30. Reserved.

#### **ARTICLE II. DOGS AND CATS**

#### Sec. 14-31. License.

- 1. *Required.* Every person residing in the city who owns a dog or cat which is more than five months of age on January 1 of any year or five months of age within the license year shall, on or before the date the dog or cat becomes five months of age, and annually thereafter, pay the dog or cat license fee and obtain a license therefore.
- 2. *Fees.* Such owner shall pay to the city clerk/treasurer the amount as established by the council from time to time by resolution. The owner of any dog or cat who fails to obtain a license prior to April 1 of each year or within 30 days of acquiring ownership of a licensable dog or cat, or fails to obtain a license on or before the dog or cat reaches licensable age shall pay an additional late fee as established by the council from time to time by resolution and be subject to further penalties pursuant to section 14-62.
- 3. *Issuance; tag.* Upon payment to the city clerk-treasurer of the required fee, the clerk-treasurer shall issue to such person a license and tag bearing a serial number in the form prescribed by Wis. Stats. § 174.07, to keep such dog or cat for the license year. The owner shall upon procuring the license place upon the dog or cat a collar and shall securely attach and keep attached the tag furnished to him by the city clerk-treasurer to the collar as required by Wis. Stats. § 174.07. If the owner desires or the animal cannot wear a collar and tag, a micro chip may be implanted so long as the information is place on file with the City. No license shall be issued under this article for any dog or cat unless the applicant exhibits a certificate of a qualified veterinarian showing that the dog or cat is currently immunized against rabies and distemper. The owner shall attach the rabies vaccination tag to a collar, which shall be kept on the dog or cat at all times, but this requirement does not apply to a dog or cat during competition or training, to a dog while hunting, to a dog while actively involved in herding or controlling livestock if the dog is under the control of its owner, as required by Wis. Stats. § 95.21(2)(f).
- 4. Every Pet specially trained to lead blind or deaf persons, designated as a service animal to the owner by a licensed medical health professional, or to provide support for mobility-impaired persons is exempt from the license fee.

#### Sec. 14-32. Applicability of state law.

The provisions of Wis. Stats. ch. 174 and Wis. Stats. § 95.21, except for imprisonment penalties imposed are hereby adopted and by reference made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth herein. Any act required to be performed or prohibited by any statute incorporated in this section by reference is required or prohibited under this Code. Any future amendments, revisions or modifications of the statutes incorporated in this section are intended to be made part of this Code.

#### Sec. 14-33. Harboring certain dogs or cats prohibited.

No person shall possess, harbor or keep any animal which:

- 1. Habitually pursues any vehicles upon any public street, alley or highway.
- 2. Which has been declared vicious.
- 3. Habitually makes noise to the annoyance of any two or more other persons.
- 4.3. Is required to be licensed, but is not.
- 5.4. Does not have a valid license tag and current rabies vaccination tag attached to a collar which is kept on the dog or cat whenever the dog or cat is outdoors and not securely confined in a fenced area.

#### Sec. 14-34. Reserved.

#### Sec. 14-35. Removal of waste deposited on public or private property.

(a) *Removal required.* Any person owning or having control of any <u>dog-animal</u> on property, public or private, which property is not owned or occupied by such person, shall promptly remove excrement left by such <u>dog-animal</u> and place it in a proper receptacle, bury it or flush it in a toilet on property owned or occupied by the person.

(b) *Possession of means of removal required.* Any person causing or permitting an animal dog to be on any property, public or private, which property is not owned or occupied by such person, shall have in his immediate possession a device or object suitable for removal of the excrement and a depository for the transmission of the excrement to property owned or occupied by the person.

(c) *Penalty*. Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of this section shall be issued a warning for the first offense and, upon conviction thereafter, shall be subject to punishment as provided in section 1-11.

#### **ARTICLE III. EXOTIC ANIMALS**

Sec. 14-40. Licensing requirements.

Any person who resides within the City limits and is the owner of an Exotic Animal which is within the City limits, shall license the Exotic Animal with the city clerk. Every person residing in the city who owns an Exotic Animal on January 1 of any year or within 30 days of acquiring ownership shall annually and thereafter obtain a license.

Such owner shall pay to the city clerk/treasurer the amount as established by the council from time to time by resolution. The owner of any Exotic Animal who fails to obtain a license prior to April 1 of each year or within 30 days of acquiring ownership of an Exotic Animal shall pay an additional late fee as established by the council from time to time by resolution and be subject to further penalties pursuant to section 14-62.

#### Sec. 14-41. Providing registration information to relevant personnel.

The city clerk shall provide copies of all Exotic Animal registrations to the police department and other emergency rescue personnel which may have reason to enter the premises where wild animals are present for purposes of rescue operations resulting from a natural disaster or personal emergency.

#### Sec. 14-42. Prohibited animals

It shall be unlawful for any person to keep maintain or have in their possession or under their control within the City any poisonous reptile or other dangerous animal, hybrid animal, carnivorous wild animal or reptile, vicious or dangerous domesticated animal or any other animal or reptile of wild, vicious, or dangerous propensities. Short term educational exhibits are exempt from this provision.

#### Sec. 14-43. Prohibited animals enumerated.

- 1. In addition to the prohibition in section 14 42, it shall be unlawful for any person to keep, maintain or have in their possession or under their control within the City any of the following animals:
  - a. Any animal which has been declared to be protected or endangered by the U.S. Department of Interior;
  - b. All poisonous animals, including snakes; that upon touch or bite may cause hallucinations, alter cardiopulmonary functions, or even death.
  - c. Badgers;
  - d. Bears
  - e. Beavers
  - f. Canids (such as: wolves, foxes, coyotes, jackals, dingoes, or raccoon dogs);

g. Civet;

- h. Constrictor snakes above six (6) feet in length
- i. Crocodilian (such as: Alligators, crocodiles, or caimans);
- j. Falconiformes (such as: eagles, hawks, owls, or falcons) except falcons and hawks in the possession of a state or federally licensed handler;
- k. Edentata (such as: anteaters, tamaduas, sloths, or armadillos);
- 1. Emus
- m. Felids (such as: lions, tigers, leopards, cheetahs, jaguars, pumas, lynx, ocelots, or bobcats);

- n. Game cocks and other fighting birds;
- o. Hyenas
- p. Marsupials (such as: opossums, Tasmanian wolf, kangaroos, koalas, or wombats);
- q. Muskrats
- r. Ostriches
- s. Porcupine
- t. Primates (such as: apes, monkeys, baboons, chimpanzees, gibbons, gorillas, orangutans, siamangs.)
- u. Procyonids (such as: raccoons, coatis, kinkajous, ring-tailed cats, or pandas)
- v. Rheas;
- w. Skunks;
- x. Squirrels;
- y. Sharks;
- z. Ungulates (such as: elephants, zebra, tapirs, rhinoceroses, camel, llama, caribou, antelope, bison, reindeer, deer, giraffe, hippopotamus, wild boar, gazelle, or gnu);
- aa. Water buffalo;
- bb. Wart hogs;
- cc. Weasels;
- dd. Wolverines;
- ee. Woodchucks; or
- ff. Any other dangerous animal.

#### Sec. 14-44. Owner to report escape of Exotic Animal.

The owner or keeper of any Exotic Animal that escapes from their custody or control shall within one hour after they discover or reasonably should have discovered the escape, report it to a law enforcement officer of the City and the County Sheriff where the escape occurred.

Secs. 14-45 - - 14-49. Reserved

#### **ARTICLE IV. CRUELTY TO ANIMALS AND RELATED OFFENSES**

#### Sec. 14-50. Cruelty to animals generally.

No Person shall beat, torture, or injure any animal, nor overload any working animal, nor shall any person abuse, mistreat or neglect any such animal.

Sec. 14.51. Reserved

#### Sec. 14-52. Humane care of animals.

All persons keeping, possessing and/or in control of an animal shall provide the animal with sufficient food and water, proper shelter, humane care and treatment and veterinary care when needed to prevent suffering. No person shall mistreat any animal nor shall any animal be abandoned. An owner may take an animal they no longer desire to care for to an Animal Shelter licensed by the State of Wisconsin.

#### Sec. 14-53. Poisoning of Pets.

It shall be unlawful for any person to administer or cause to be administered a substance which they knew or should have known was a poison of any sort whatsoever to any Pet, or to place any poison or poisoned food where the same is accessible to any Pet.

#### Sec. 14-54. Instigating or allowing fights between animals.

No person shall engage in or allow any fighting between animals of any kind upon their premises or premises in their possession or under their control in the City. No person shall keep any house, pit, or other place to be used in permitting fights between animals. No person shall instigate or encourage any animal to attack, bite, wound, or worry another animal for any bet, stake, reward or entertainment.

#### Sec. 14-55. Injured or ill animals.

Whenever an animal control officer encounters a stray animal suffering pain, the animal control officer may take the animal to a veterinarian where the cost of any care or treatment shall be borne by the owner of the animal. If ownership of the animal cannot be determined, the animal control officer shall impound the animal for five days unless it appears that a longer impoundment will lead to identification of the owner. If the owner cannot be located the animal may be disposed of by humane means without notice.

#### Secs. 14-56 - - 14-59. Reserved.

#### **ARTICLE V. COMMERCIAL ANIMAL ESTABLISHMENTS.**

#### Sec. 14-60. Permit Required.

No Person or entity shall operate a commercial animal establishment without first obtaining a permit. An application for a commercial animal establishment permit shall be made to the city clerk, and the applicant shall pay a fee prior to the city clerk issuing a commercial animal establishment permit. No permit shall be granted without an inspection of the premises to determine compliance with this Code and state law. The permit shall be issued for one year, commencing on January 1 of each year. Renewal applications for permits shall be made 30 days prior to and up to 30 days after the start of the calendar year. If there is a change of ownership of a commercial animal establishment, the new owner shall obtain a permit.

#### Sec. 14-61. Operation of Commercial Animal Establishments.

**Every Commercial Animal Establishment:** 

- 1. Shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition and not to allow any refuse or waste material to accumulate.
- 2. Shall have impervious, smooth and cleanable floors.
- 3. Shall post its permit in a conspicuous place open to the public.
- 4. Shall isolate and treat any animal in its possession which has any disease, injure, or abnormality and may not sell such animal without full disclosure to the buyer of the condition of the animal.

- 5. Shall furnish the buyer of any animal, except fish, with a written statement of sale showing the date of sale, approximate age of the animal, immunization and medication type and date administered, and the names of both the seller and buyer.
- 6. Shall take measures to limit the potential creation of a noise nuisance and take measures to mitigate the actual noise at the establishment or premise.
- A violation of this chapter shall be cause for revocation of the Commercial Animal Establishment Permit. (Ord. 2020-05)

#### **ARTICLE VI. ENFORCEMENT**

#### Sec. 14-62. Penalties for violations of Chapter 14.

Any person who shall violate any section within this chapter is subject to the penalties set forth in section 1-11 of the City ordinances, in addition to any other remedies or sanctions stated with this Chapter

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## **Proposed Changes to Animal Ordinance Chapter 14-1**

#### I. Change of 14-1.6 & .7 Definitions:

**1. Animal:** means any multicellular organism under the scientific kingdom classification of Animalia.

4. Cat: a small domesticated carnivore, Felis domestica or F. catus, bred in a number of varieties.

5. Dog: a domesticated canid, Canis familiaris, bred in many varieties.

**6. Domestic Pet.** means an animal that has been traditionally tamed and kept by humans as a service animal, or pet such as birds (i.e. caged birds such as parakeets, finches, macaws, and typically caged birds); small caged animals like hamsters, ferrets, sugar gliders, chinchillas, pet rats and gerbils: fish, but does not include Dogs or Cats.

7. Exotic Animal. Means any animal which is kept within the city limits by a person, and does not meet the definition provided under Domestic Pet and is not a dog or cat.

**10.** Pet: means all animals which are kept or cared for within the city limits by a person and including Exotic Animals, Domestic Pets, Dogs or Cats.

**13. Service Animal:** Any pet or animal under an owner's care that is to provide support to the owner due to blindness, deafness, lack of mobility or other diagnosable mental and physical conditions.

- In #6 change "but does not include Dogs or Cats" to "including Dogs and Cats."
- ▶ In #7 remove "and is not a dog or cat."
- In #13 remove "Any per or animal under an owner's care that is to provide support to the owner due to blindness, deafness, lack of mobility or either other diagnosable mental and physical conditions." For licensing purposes a service animal is defined as specially trained to lead blind, or deaf person or provide support for mobility-impaired persons.

**Reason:** This removes the confusion with Dogs as Domestic Pets and Service Animals.

#### II. Change of 14-2.1.f:

#### Sec. 14-2. Excessive Animal Hoarding, Sheltering and Ownership.

- 1. No property owner shall make or allow such use of property or harbor animals in a manner that creates one of the following violations:
  - a. Neglect of the Animals The number of animals located at the property causing violations of 14-50 and/or 14-52 can be enforced under this provision.
  - b. Unsanitary Conditions for Humans –The location and/or number of animals cause or reasonably may cause health consequences to an individual or community such as, but not limited to, infectious bites or scratches to neighborhood children, Toxoplasmosis, asthma triggering caused by excessive urine, Leptospirosis, hookworms, Psittacosis, Lymphocytic Choriomeningitis Virus, Brucellosis, Scabies, Cryptosporidiosis, tape worms, insect infestation and rabies.

- c. Unsanitary Conditions for Animals The number of animals in relation to the space available and/or care provided could cause the spread of distemper, ringworm, flea anemia, Toxoplasmosis, asthma triggering caused by excessive urine, Leptospirosis, hookworms, Psittacosis, Lymphocytic Choriomeningitis Virus, Brucellosis, Scabies, Cryptosporidiosis, tape worms, insect infestation, rabies and other unsanitary conditions.
- d. Harboring or Attracting Feral and Stray Animals –The property owner's actions or allowance of such actions on their property creates a harbor for feral and/or stray animals by the creation of feeding stations, leaving the premises open for animals to freely leave and return or not properly containing their refuse.
- e. Shelters –Evansville ordinances allow animal shelters to be permitted under proper licensing and zoning requirements. Shelters that are temporary, non-profit and commercial must be properly licensed, zoned, and maintained so that they do not violate any other section of the municipal code. This sub-section excludes family/friends or volunteers of non-profit shelters watching an animal temporarily unless a separate violation of this Chapter occurs. If a separate violation occurs then this section may be enforced without exception.
- f. Noise Disturbance Violation of ordinance 14-8 and/or 82.161
- g. Property Maintenance and Nuisance Violations of any ordinances pertaining to the maintenance and care of properties caused by the number of animals or causes the attraction of animals that may result a public nuisance.
- 2. Any property owner creating or allowing such a violation shall be responsible for the humane disposal or placement of the animals to the extent the property is no longer in violation of local ordinances.

- Strikeout "and/or 82.161".

#### Reason:

82.161 refers to "person(s)" and not applicable in this chapter.

#### III. Change of 14-8:

- 14-8: No person may keep a Pet which disturbs the peace by loud or unusual noises at any time of the day or night
- Strikeout "disturbs the peace by loud or unusual noises at any time of the day or night." and replace with "habitually makes noise to the annoyance of any two or more other persons." Ordinance should read, "No person may keep a Pet which habitually makes noise to the annoyance of any two or more other persons."

#### Reason:

This change makes consistency for all animals referred to in the definition of "Pet".

#### Aticle II Dogs & Cats:

#### Sec 14.31- Sec. 14-31. License.

1.Required. Every person residing in the city who owns a dog or cat which is more than five months of age on January 1 of any year or five months of age within the license year shall, on or before the date the dog or cat becomes five months of age, and annually thereafter, pay the dog or cat license fee and obtain a license therefore.

2.Fees. Such owner shall pay to the city clerk/treasurer the amount as established by the council from time to time by resolution. The owner of any dog or cat who fails to obtain a license prior to April 1 of each year or within 30 days of acquiring ownership of a licensable dog or cat, or fails to obtain a license on or before the dog or cat reaches licensable age shall pay an additional late fee as established by the council from time to time by resolution and be subject to further penalties pursuant to section 14-62.

3.Issuance; tag. Upon payment to the city clerk-treasurer of the required fee, the clerktreasurer shall issue to such person a license and tag bearing a serial number in the form prescribed by Wis. Stats. § 174.07, to keep such dog or cat for the license year. The owner shall upon procuring the license place upon the dog or cat a collar and shall securely attach and keep attached the tag furnished to him by the city clerk-treasurer to the collar as required by Wis. Stats. § 174.07. If the owner desires or the animal cannot wear a collar and tag, a micro-chip may be implanted so long as the information is place on file with the City. No license shall be issued under this article for any dog or cat unless the applicant exhibits a certificate of a qualified veterinarian showing that the dog or cat is currently immunized against rabies and distemper. The owner shall attach the rabies vaccination tag to a collar, which shall be kept on the dog or cat at all times, but this requirement does not apply to a dog or cat during competition or training, to a dog while hunting, to a dog or cat securely confined indoors, to a dog or cat securely confined in a fenced area or to a dog while actively involved in herding or controlling livestock if the dog is under the control of its owner, as required by Wis. Stats. § 95.21(2)(f).

4.Every Pet specially trained to lead blind or deaf persons, designated as a service animal to the owner by a licensed medical health professional, or to provide support for mobility-impaired persons is exempt from the license fee.

# 3 Strikeout "If the owner desires or the animal cannot wear a collar and tag, a micro-chip may be implanted so long as the information is place on file with the City." & Strikeout "Distemper

#### Reason:

The City does not have a system to track/search microchip numbers. WI SS does not require distemper only rabies. We've come across some dogs that are allergic to distemper shots.

# 4 Strikeout "designated as a service animal to the owner by a licensed medical health professional,"

#### Reason:

Per WI State statute 174.055 the only exemptions are dogs for blind, deaf & mobility impaired

#### VI. Change of 14-33:

#### 14-33. Harboring certain dogs or cats prohibited.

No person shall possess, harbor or keep any animal which:

- 1. Habitually pursues any vehicles upon any public street, alley or highway.
- 2. Which has been declared vicious.
- 3. Habitually makes noise to the annoyance of any two or more other persons.
- 4. Is required to be licensed, but is not.
- 5. Does not have a valid license tag and current rabies vaccination tag attached to a collar which is kept on the dog or cat whenever the dog or cat is outdoors and not securely confined in a fenced area.
- Strikeout 14-33.3, "Habitually makes noise to the annoyance of any two or more other persons."

#### Reason:

With the proposed changes, this is now addressed in 14-8 and applies to all pets and unnecessary for 14-33 which refers to just cats and dogs.

#### Sec. 14-35. Removal of waste deposited on public or private property.

(a) *Removal required.* Any person owning or having control of any animal on property, public or private, which property is not owned or occupied by such person, shall promptly remove excrement left by such dog and place it in a proper receptacle, bury it or flush it in a toilet on property owned or occupied by the person.

(b) *Possession of means of removal required.* Any person causing or permitting an animal to be on any property, public or private, which property is not owned or occupied by such person, shall have in his immediate possession a device or object suitable for removal of the excrement and a depository for the transmission of the excrement to property owned or occupied by the person.

(c) *Penalty*. Any person who fails to comply with any of the provisions of this section shall be issued a warning for the first offense and, upon conviction thereafter, shall be subject to punishment as provided in section 1-11.
