 - A. **Presentation and discussion for:** CSA Coalition Bike Ride being hosted at Lake Leota Park on September 15, 2024.
Tess Romanski from CSA Coalition spoke to the committee about the bike ride starting and ending at Lake Leota Park on September 15, 2024. This is the 16th ride the CSA Coalition has done and they are expected to have 800 riders participating in this ride. There are two different routes riders can take 35 miles or 60 miles. The riders will be visiting four farms on the route Winter Fell Acers, TP Produce Farm, Still Point Flower Farm, and Uwalay Farms. Goes from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. with staggered starts at 9 a.m. & 10 a.m. Tess Romanski says they cap the riders at 800. Chief Reese and Chief Kleisch will meet the CSA Coalition later to go over the routes and safety issues.
 - B. **Discussion with possible motion to approve the Long-Term Street Closure License Application for:** Kevin Hinker, 557 Farwell Dr., Oregon, WI 53575 for closure of Lincoln Street over spring break March 25th to the 29th.

Corridon asked about the dates as on the application as it only states the 25th. Mr. Hinker called back and stated that he would be closing it the week of Spring Break to not be in the way of the school buses. Stuart asked if the

whole street would be closed. Explained that the street will be closed for his equipment as there would not be a passing lane with the equipment and not tearing up the road.

Officer Delgado and Officer Z had a reading session with the kids, EPD will receive recognition at the Winter Chiefs Conference for being accredited in 2023 policy reviews continue to be conducted, the final touches on the new Squad 3 are being completed and it is anticipated to be at the PD for duty February 7th.*

Calls were down for the month of January from last year. 69% of the monthly schedule was covered by at least 1 AEMT on duty. We have six people taking the AEMT classes, Chief Kleisch attended WEMSA conference. Bi-Annual inspection happened on February 7th and everything passes. Talked about the maintenance on ambulances and discussed budgeting for an extended warranty with the purchase of the new one in 2026. Corridon congratulated the EMS on keeping the route time to 6 minutes.*

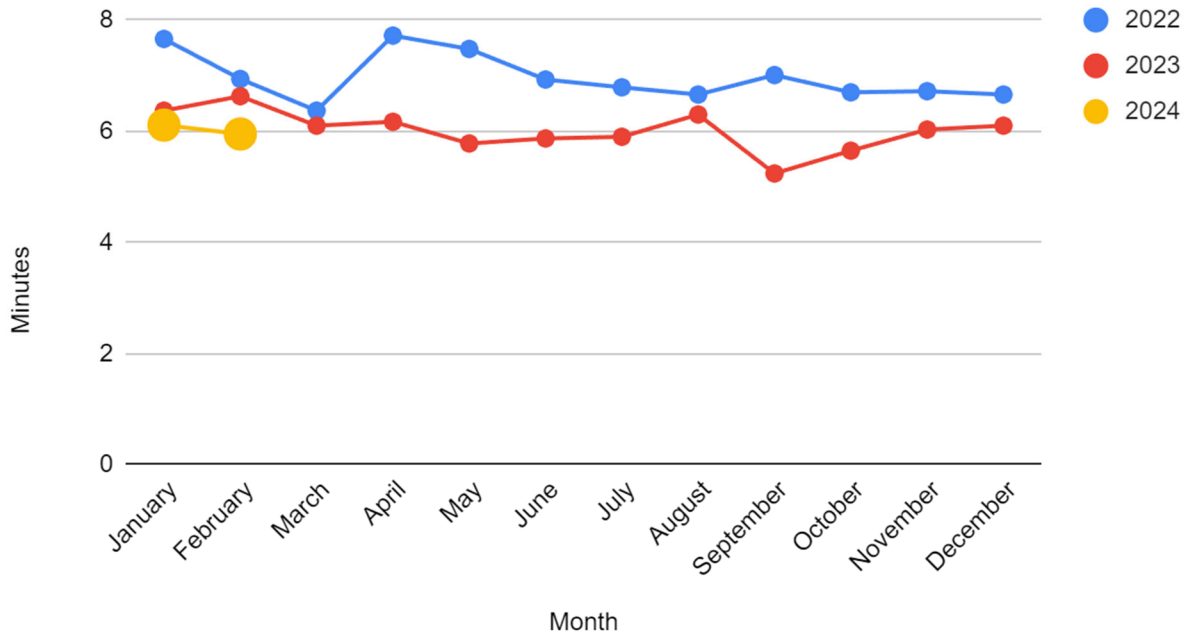
- a. 58 Calls during the month of Feb 2024 (641-28/642-30)

- 1- EMS training was on Cardiac Emergencies with Mercy

- 3- Most of our EMS providers responded to and were available for the 48 hours following the Tornado. Carolyn and Morgan attended several meetings following the tornado with the County and Emergency management. EMT/FF Bill C. assisted in the EM trailer as a scribe all night Thursday and returned to fill in for Asst. Chief Larson on Friday night.
